# St Nicholas of Myra Celebrating 175 Years Anniversary(1939-2014):

This Sunday 22 February the SMMK choir will participate in the 175 year anniversary of St Nicholas of Myra Parish. Here are a few interesting historical facts about our Parish:

- The foundation stone of the first St Nicholas Church was laid by Archbishop Polding on 9 December, 1839.
- The first priest in Penrith was Reverend Charles Sumner.
- The first St Nicholas' Church was consecrated by Archbishop Polding on 13 November, 1850.
- Before the current presbytery was built, the Priests stayed with Catholic families in the area.
- The current presbytery was opened on 27 November 1932.
- The present St Nicholas of Myra Church was officially opened and blessed by Cardinal Gilroy on 30 April, 1967.
- Over the years the Parish of Penrith has given birth to other thriving parish communities such as Kingswood (1970); Emu Plains (1974); Cranebrook (1992) and more recently Glenmore Park Catholic community.
- The first school was located on the site of the present presbytery. It operated from 1862 to 1880.
- In 1880, the Sisters of St Joseph opened the St Joseph 's School, situated in Evans St (between High and Henry Streets). It was the first school opened by the Sisters of St Joseph.
- In 1954, the school closed as a parish school when St Nicholas of Myra Primary School opened.
- Over the years the Parish has contributed to the establishment of St Nicholas of Myra Primary, Mary MacKillop Primary at Penrith South, Caroline Chisholm College at Glenmore Park, Corpus Christi Primary at Cranebrook, Bethany Primary at Glenmore Park, and McCarthy High School at Emu Plains.

I am looking forward to celebrating this special occasion with the community on Sunday.

# NRL Tackles Bullying:

### **ICAS** Competitions

Earlier this week, children in Years 3-6 would have brought home information about the University of NSW ICAS (International Competitions And Assessments For Schools) tests. At St Mary MacKillop, we provide opportunities for the children to participate in Science, English, Writing and Mathematics. There is a cost associated with each of these assessments, which is used to cover the printing of the material, the marking and the certificate that all children receive. Please complete and return the slip indicating which test(s) your child will be participating in. Please be aware that these tests are voluntary and quite challenging. A hard copy of the results will be provided through the school approximately six weeks after the test sitting date.

# Religious Education News

### **Opening School Mass:**

Please join us for our Opening School Mass in our Multi Purpose Hall tomorrow, Friday 21 February, at 9:15am. At our mass we will gather as a school community to pray for God's blessing on the school year. Looking forward to seeing you there as we celebrate our catholic Faith together.

### St Nicholas 175 Year Mass:

This year our Parish, St Nicholas of Myra, is celebrating 175 years of ministry to the Penrith District. As part of the Parish celebrations there will be a special Mass this Sunday, 23 February at 10:00am. The student choirs from St Mary MacKillop and St Nicholas will be leading the thanksgiving song after communion. There will be refreshments served after mass and everyone is warmly invited to attend this parish celebration.

### Ash Wednesday:

Wednesday 5 March is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. The Season of Lent is the 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count) and is a time of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday is the day for us to take stock of our spiritual lives and we are encouraged to attend Mass on this day in order to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. As Lent begins, we should set out specific spiritual goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them - for instance receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

# To celebrate the beginning of Lent all students will attend an Ash Wednesday Liturgy at 10:00am. All parents and family members are warmly invited to attend this special prayer time. During the liturgy, the ashes which give Ash Wednesday its name will be distributed. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. While the ashes symbolise penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. The distribution of ashes, is a tangible reminder of our own need to focus on being better people. Through



acts of penance comes a change of heart – a coming back to God. Our personal Lenten journey should be marked with reflection, prayer and penance. Throughout Lent we should strive to model the actions of Christ. As the prophet Joel wrote: *Now, now – it is the Lord who speaks – come back to me with all your heart.*

As part of our celebration for Catholic Schools Week (10-14 March) we will have a whole school liturgy at 2:00pm followed by open classrooms on Tuesday 11 March. All parents are warmly invited to attend this celebration of faith and learning.
