This week I attended the St Mary MacKillop, Parent and Friends meeting for Term Two. As always, a dedicated group of parents represented our community in guiding and advising the school on its growth and development.

One exciting item on the agenda was the review / evaluation of our 2018 fete and the announcement of the overall takings from the event. The team did a fantastic job in bringing our community together through a well organised, well attended demonstration of home, school and parish working as one. I am very pleased to announce on behalf of the P and F and the Fete committee that the profit collected from the 2018 fete is: **\$20 299.59**

The project that these funds will pay for was decided at the start of the year through consultation with the school staff, principal and P and F. The decision was made, that due to a number of our classroom i-pads becoming too old to remain on the school network beyond 2018, that we would purchase new i-pads for use across a number of our classrooms. The money raised through the fete ensures that we can continue the high quality of learning that we pride ourselves on at St Mary MacKillop. This learning will continue with the support of great, accessible technology. Keeping our kids Cyber-Safe

This term the staff at St Mary MacKillop have been working closely with our children to teach them how to stay safe when they are online and using technology. With Cyber-bullying becoming a significant concern for families across Australia, we decided to make 'Bullying' the focus area for our Peer Support sessions this year. Every Friday in Term 2, our students are put in mixed groups across grades and are led by Year 6 in understanding what bullying is and what we can all do to keep everyone safe. Our Year 6 students were trained to lead this program earlier this year.

Our teachers have also taught every class about our school 'Acceptable Use of Technology' Agreement. They have taken the children through what their responsibilities are when using technology at school and at home and why this is an important part of being a Safe, Respectful, Learner.

The Year 4, 5 and 6 classes have also used technology at school, in the form of our 'Apple TV's' and 'Google Hangouts', to connect with professionals from Kids Helpline. During these online conference sessions, every class has been taught some very useful strategies to avoid being in unsafe situations whilst using the internet and social media.

I sincerely hope that the work we are undertaking here at school also supports each and every one of you as parents at home in developing safe online habits for your children.

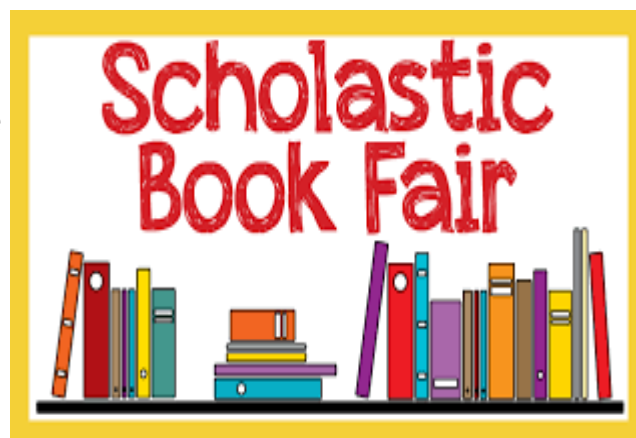

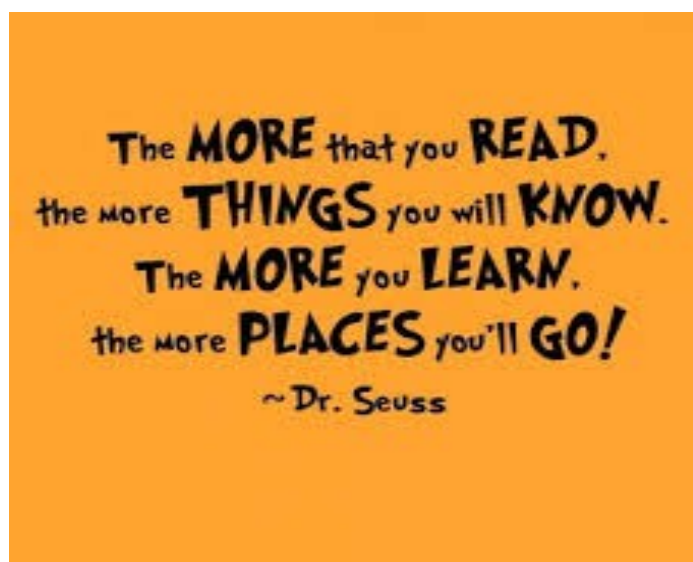
Library News

Sacramental Program – First Holy Communion

The word 'communion' means to be united with; Catholics believe that in Holy Communion we are united in a special way with Jesus Christ.

At his Last Supper, Jesus said of the bread that he shared among his followers, "Take and eat, this is my body."

When we receive Holy Communion, Catholics believe that in a mysterious way we are sharing in the body and blood of Christ. Holy Communion and the whole celebration is also known as Eucharist, from a Greek word meaning thanksgiving.

First Eucharist is a special occasion – a further step in becoming one with Christ and united with the people of God. For most people First Eucharist takes place at about the age of 9-10 years. Children should have an understanding of the sacrament that is appropriate to their age. Hopefully, this understanding will develop over the years. The church affirms that parents are the first educators of their children in the faith. You are handing on your faith to your children all the time. You have the wonderful responsibility of preparing your child to receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Usually the celebration of First Eucharist takes place at Sunday Mass. This is the most appropriate time. As the first reception of Eucharist marks a key step in the initiation of your child into the community of the church, it is most appropriate that the gathered community welcomes your child. The celebration of Mass is not just a special occasion for your family, but for the whole parish community.

Your child needs to feel at home in the parish community. Therefore, ideally, your child should receive First Eucharist at whichever Parish and Mass she or he usually attends.

Beanie and Donation Day - Wednesday 20th June

Peer Support Group Program

The Peer Support Group Program continues for all students. There will be 8 sessions and each week will have a different focus.

Week 5

The number of children directly involved in bullying behaviours is usually quite low, however the number of children who know that bullying is occurring is significantly higher. For the next 2 weeks in Peer Support, children will have the opportunity to discuss the ways they can speak up against bullying behaviours in our school and make a difference. This week they examine their role as bystanders and how to seek help for someone who is being bullied.



Week 6

This is the second week that we have focused on the behaviour of bystanders during Peer Support. This week, children will practise ways of responding to bullying whether they are directly involved or not, by talking to the child doing the bullying, the child being bullied or a responsible adult. We use a turn, talk or tell model to support children to develop strategies for dealing with bullying behaviours. This is not easy for many young people so your child may need encouragement to persevere.

We will keep you updated with the progress of this program through the KIT .

Building Child Safe Communities - Forms For All Volunteers

'Building Child Safe Communities' is an initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering at schools. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on '**Volunteer Form**' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

If you would like to be a parent helper at sports carnivals, reading groups, gala days, excursions etc you will need to complete the form.

School Banking

School banking day is Friday. School banking encourages your child to develop regular savings habits by giving them the opportunity to deposit money into their Youthsaver account at school each week. The old phone number is still in effect and will be for the next 12 months, however, when we call you the new contact phone number will be shown on your caller id.

Afternoon Pick Up

Please pick up all children at 3pm across the road in the park. Do not come into the playground to collect your child or take them from lines as this creates safety issues for our children.

The teacher on duty will bring any children who are not collected from the park by 3.05pm up to the school playground onto our waiters line. If a child is not collected by their parent across the road, please **DO NOT** keep the child waiting with you, they must return with the teacher on duty.

If your child is on waiters, they can be collected from the playground between 3.10pm—3.30pm

Changing After School Travel Arrangements

If you need to change the after school travel arrangements for your child on a permanent basis, could you please forward a note to the classroom teacher.



If a change to after school travel arrangements is required after you have dropped your child at school, please contact the school office. Please be mindful that the office staff need to communicate this message to teachers and students and the process for this is to send a form to the child via the office bag which is collected from the office at 2pm. We ask that you please, where possible, make these requests before 2pm so that we can ensure the message reaches your child in a timely manner.

School Bag App Instructions

For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).



Busways School Opal Tap Campaign Term 2

We have received the following information from Busways:

Term 2 will see Busways continuing to look to your school for support in our efforts to enforce the use of Opal cards on our buses.

This term will see Busways Inspectors checking to ensure students are using their Opal cards when boarding the school bus. Students that do not present a valid Opal card will be asked to pay a fare. Failure to produce a valid Opal card or bus fare will result in the Inspector recording the student's name.

Below is an example of the form our Inspectors will use.

After the school inspection the names that were recorded will be emailed to the school, with a request for the school to follow-up with the students and parents/guardians concerned.

All students need to produce a •School Opal card •Child/Youth Opal card •Or pay a fare to travel on our buses.

Please explain to the students and parents involved that an Opal card is important because it is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't have an Opal card to tap on and off the service will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Calling for old Smartphones!

St Mary MacKillop will be trialling using Google Cardboard this year. Google Cardboard is a virtual reality (VR) platform developed by Google for use with a head mount for a smartphone. Named for its fold-out cardboard viewer, the platform is a low-cost system. The benefits of using VR in education include;



- Enabling students to learn about science, history, and geography in a much more immersive way
- Promoting curiosity and exploration by inviting students to go on impossible field trips in space or in history
- Taking students to places where they can't physically go.

As we are trialling Google Cardboard, we need smartphones to get them working. We are asking for any old smartphones that you would be willing to donate. The VR apps only require WIFI capability. SIM cards and personal data should be removed off your phone (this can be done by restoring factory settings). If you don't have a charger to go with the phone that's not a problem.
