Penrith Council

Recently I was made aware of Penrith City Council seeking community feedback regarding 'The Public Open Space Reinvestment Project'. As a result I attended an information session on a Sunday in the park across the road from our school. I have included below a summary of the project intent from the Penrith City Council website. "The Public Open Space Reinvestment Project is focussing on quality open spaces for our more established neigh-

bourhoods. Council is working with the community to decide if we should consider selling some small parcels of land that provide little recreational value and reinvest some of the money in improving other recreation spaces in their area. The project process includes an assessment of the amount of open space available in a suburb and, more importantly, the quality of local open space."

On attending the information session and listening to resident's concerns, it became apparent to me that the residents are very happy with the current facilities as they stand are not looking for further improvements, development or sale of these spaces. As I understand it, the residents are attracted to this area because of the 'green spaces' that create a buffer between the blocks of housing and provide a sense of space.

My advice to families living in this area is to seek information from the council so that you have all the relevant information and then regardless of your position on this issue, make the effort to have your voice heard. Penrith City Council is calling for consultation from the community and if they hear silence they may assume this to be agreement with their strategy. The Season of Easter

Easter is the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. It is celebrated on Sunday, and marks the end of Holy Week, the end of Lent, the last day of the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday), and is the beginning of the Easter season of the liturgical year.



As we know from the Gospels, Jesus Christ rose from the dead on the third day following his crucifixion, which would be Sunday. His resurrection marks the triumph of good over evil, sin and death. It is the singular event, which proves that those who trust in God and accept Christ will be raised from the dead.

Since Easter represents the fulfilment of God's promises to mankind, it is the most important holiday on the Christian calendar.

In the Gospels, the precise details of the Easter narrative vary slightly, however, despite the variances, the key aspects of the Easter story all match. Above all, they agree that the tomb of Christ was indeed empty, which is the most essential fact.

Sacramental Program – First Holy Communion

Preparation for Holy Communion began on Wednesday 17th May for the children who have enrolled in the First Communion Sacramental Program.

Please remember as you are preparing your child to receive Eucharist, for the first time, it is important that you and your child attend Mass. Through participating in the Mass the children will see where the

Liturgy of the Eucharist fits within the structure of the Mass and they will observe first hand the reverence of this special Sacrament.

I invite all in our community to pray for the children who are preparing to receive their second Sacrament of Initiation.

Masses and Liturgies – Reverence and Safety

St Mary MacKillop is a unique Catholic school, in the fact that we do not have a parish church on site for celebrating masses and liturgies. Prior to the construction of the hall many of our liturgical celebrations had to be held outside and were dependent on weather conditions.

Our beautiful hall is a wonderful space that is used for so many educational activities, however, whenever we use our hall for a religious celebration this space becomes sacred, much like a church and out of respect and reverence we do not eat or drink during a liturgy or mass.

In addition, *hot drinks cannot be consumed during religious celebrations due to our duty of care and Work, Health & Safety regulations about hot drinks around students.* Thank you in anticipation of your support.

<u>Mary Help of Christians – Wednesday 24th May</u>

Wednesday the 24th of May is the Solemnity of Mary Help of Christians – the Patron Saint of Australia.

Mary Help of Christians was adopted as patron of the infant Church of Australia in 1844 at a significant time in our history. British settlement was just over fifty years old, the transportation of convicts was coming

to an end, and the first elections in Australian history had been held in 1843. Issues of land, immigration and education had begun to surface and the Church was involved in these social problems. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed, except

for one brief year, until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive.

Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary and was the first nation to choose her under the title Help of Christians, as principal Patroness. The Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry, dedicated St Mary's Cathedral to Mary. He arrived in Sydney in 1820 and assumed responsibility for the planning and initial construction of the Cathedral. When Australia became the first country to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness, it became the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title.

On the Solemnity of Mary Help of Christians we pray the following prayer:

Almighty God, Deepen in our hearts our love of Mary Help of Christians. Through her prayers and under her protection, may the light of Christ shine over our land. May Australia be granted harmony, justice and peace. Grant wisdom to our leaders and integrity to our citizens. Bless especially the men and women of the Australian Defence Force and their families. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen. Mary Help of Christians, pray for us.

Week 3-19 May 2017

We are celebrating success in Peer Support this week. The children identify their strengths and achievements and the role of perseverance in achieving a personal best.

Ask your child to tell you which word they chose to best describe their own strengths and qualities so you can affirm them in this area.

Week 4-26 May 2017

This week in Peer Support, we introduce students to the recurring theme in Taking Opportunities; the jack in the box. Children discuss the different ways of responding to difficult situations and learn that they can cope by having a go, being positive and not giving up. We have called this being resilient. The construction of their own jack in the box serves as a reminder to the children that they can spring back when they feel under pressure from circumstances.

Encourage your child to discuss their understanding of resilience and the need to practice resilience whenever they get the opportunity. You might like to help them find a prominent place in your home for their jack in the box as a visible reminder.


