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NEW BISHOP APPOINTED

As you are most probably aware, His Holiness Pope Francis recently appointed the Most Reverend Vincent Long Van Nguyen O.F.M. Conv. DD, as the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Parramatta.

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Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop Primary School.

Bishop Long Van Nguyen comes to the Diocese with a rich understanding of the challenges and opportunities of multiculturalism in western Sydney. The new Bishop of Parramatta was born in 1961 in Gia-Kiem, Vietnam. In 1972, he joined the diocesan minor seminary which was later disbanded by the communist Government. In 1980 he left Vietnam to begin a new life in Australia.

After his ordination to the priesthood on 30 December 1989, Bishop Long went to Rome for further studies and was awarded a licentiate in Christology and Spirituality from the Pontifical Faculty of St Bonaventure.

He was elected Superior of Conventual Franciscans in Australia in 2005 and appointed as Assistant General of the same Order and transferred to Rome in 2008. He was appointed an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Melbourne on 20 May 2011.

Bishop Long is familiar with the western Sydney community, having been parish priest at Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville from 1998-2002. His appointment demonstrates the Church's support and understanding of the unique needs of our community.

We will welcome Bishop Long at his formal installation in St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta, at a date that will be set in the near future.

PENTECOST

Last weekend we celebrated Pentecost Sunday as part of the liturgical year. You might be aware of the T.V. program, "Extreme Makeover", in which people are given the opportunity to undergo cosmetic surgery to help them to "look better". This "makeover" process promises to make people happy and to feel better about themselves. Millions of people world-wide undergo cosmetic surgery, botox injections as well as decorative tattooing and body piercing to make themselves look special, more appealing, more "unique".

Many people seem to be not satisfied with themselves the way they are. They want a "change for the better" and these procedures offer change, "happiness" and above all transformation. Of course, appearance is important but it is not what life is all about.

Two thousand years ago a small group of Jewish people was very much wondering what life was all about. They were hiding in a small house, anxious, perplexed and in fear of their own lives. Their leader, who had been their inspiration, had been executed, had come back to them in a mysterious resurrected form and then, had ascended into the clouds before their very eyes. Their lives were in turmoil. Things had been going so well for the past three years and now disaster. And what were they to make of Jesus' words to them, "I am going to the Father but I will send you the Holy Spirit"?

Little did the Apostles realise they were about to have their very own "Extreme Makeover." When the Spirit did come to them, they heard the sound of a rushing wind and saw tongues of fire above each other's head; but what they felt was a total internal transformation. From their mouths came words they had never heard before and understanding that came from a source beyond their means. They were filled with joy, their fear was gone, all negativity had vanished and they were completely unconcerned about themselves. They were flabbergasted but totally inspired. They left their hiding place and relished the crowds that came to them; by the end of the day, they had baptised three thousand people. They had become other Christs in the world and would continue to do His work till, like Him, most were executed.

LET US PRAY Jesus, □ come into our hearts this Pentecost Day, give us the gift of your Spirit. □ Help us to be Your people in our world. May Your Spirit "transform" us this day and help us to become more like You. Amen

Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy: 8th December 2105 – 20th November 2016

The Corporal Works of Mercy

Last KIT the Corporal Works of Mercy were introduced. This week I would like to unpack the first 2 of these works and their implications for our lives today.

The seven Corporal Works of Mercy are:

- (1) Feed the hungry.
- (2) Give drink to the thirsty.
- (3) Clothe the naked.
- (4) Shelter the homeless.
- (5) Visit those in prison.
- (6) Comfort the sick.
- (7) Bury the dead.



Perhaps your first reaction upon reading this traditional list might be, "This list is a bit out of date. After all, when do we ever have the opportunity in the modern world to

'give drink to the thirsty' or to 'clothe the naked'? And who in their right mind would fail to bury their loved ones these days!"

Don't be too hasty, however, in dismissing the usefulness of this old list of the corporal works of mercy. It may be more helpful than you think in challenging us to discern new ways that our merciful Saviour is calling us to follow Him.

Feed the Hungry

On the surface at least, feeding the hungry seems fairly straightforward. We can help the hungry in simple ways: for example,

- making donations to the local food charity
- if we have the time, by helping at a local soup kitchen for the homeless
- we can take the time to educate ourselves about the problem of hunger in the world
- the next time you make a recipe that can be easily frozen, make a double batch and donate one to your local parish or soup kitchen
- Try not to purchase more food than you are able to eat. If you notice that you end up throwing groceries away each week, purchasing less groceries would eliminate waste and allow you to donate the savings to those in need.

Give Drink to the Thirsty

Many people do not have access to clean water and suffer from the lack of this basic necessity. We should support the efforts of those working towards greater accessibility of this essential resource by:

- supporting clean water policies to ensure that there will be clean water for future generations to drink.
- preserving clean, fresh water: for example, by using environmentally friendly laundry detergents
- Make an effort not to waste water. Remembering to turn off the water tap when you are brushing your teeth or washing dishes can help, especially in regions suffering from drought donate to help build wells for water for those in need

At this point, you may be thinking, "It all sounds inspiring in principle, but what can I possibly do? I am already so weighed down with my own issues and responsibilities. I cannot possibly take on any more burdens. I cannot possibly do all these things you suggest!"

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

 Contractors – please click on <u>Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for</u> <u>Contractors</u> or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <u>http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).



Then click on 'Contractor Form' (bottom of page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change
