Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

> At this time of the year our teachers are analysing assessment tasks, reporting student growth and progress and preparing to meet with you to discuss your child's learning.

Throughout the year, teachers regularly meet with their teaching partners to reflect, analyse and compare each student's work with the syllabus standard. This reflection phase allows teachers the opportunity to evaluate the success of teaching strategies as well as setting a clear direction for future planning for the learning of the students in their class. This phase allows for individual needs to be clearly understood and specific programs to be developed.

At St Mary MacKillop we have developed high expectations for our students' learning. When you receive your child's report, remember to refer to the statements of achievement that describe your child's level of success in each Key Learning Area. Also remember to pay attention to your child's work habits. You might like to keep the following four tips in mind when reading your child's report:

1. Look for strengths first. Focus on the strengths and celebrate these areas.

2. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then they have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.

3. Broaden your focus to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence their happiness and well-being.

4. Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

Students from Years 1 to 6 will receive a level of achievement in each Key Learning Area based on a scale described by the letters A-E. It is important to remember that the majority of students are expected to receive 'C' grades which indicate that they are achieving the expected outcomes. Students in Kindergarten will receive a level of achievement based on a scale: Working Towards, Working At and Working Beyond.

A lot of time and consideration is put into allocating the grades for each student. Grades are allocated based on a number of variables such as student work samples, assessment tasks, observations and class work.

Please keep in mind that your child's grades may have varied from previous years, especially if they have moved into a new stage this year.

Sometimes the A-E scale is confusing for parents as it is not graded in the same way that reports were constructed when we were at school. To put the A-E reporting system into perspective, it may be helpful to look at the analogy below for driving a car.

Feast of the Birth of John the Baptist - Whole School Mass - 9:15am Fri 22nd June




Mrs Mitchell's Retirement and Farewell Prayer - 2pm Wednesday 4th July

KEEPING IN TOUCH

The School Athletics Carnival for all children from Years 3-6 (and students from Year 2 turning 8 years old in 2018) has been scheduled for Thursday, 5 July 2018 at Parker St Oval, Kingswood. It is compulsory for all students to attend.

Buses will depart St Mary MacKillop School at 8:45am. We hope to begin the carnival by 9:30am with the 800m event. The children will remain in their age groups throughout the day, rotating through four activities including 100m, 200m, long jump and shot put. The day will conclude with 100m and 200m finals comprising of the fastest times from the heats. Please note that all children will compete and be measured in shot put within their class sport lessons prior to or after the athletics carnival.

There will also be a canteen available for snacks and each group will have a lunch break factored into their rotation. This is the only time that the canteen facilities can be used by the students.

The children are to wear their **school sports uniform** for the carnival including their hat and sunscreen. They may wear a t-shirt in their house colour. The grass is often wet in the morning, we recommend bringing a small towel to sit on. Students will need to bring their own morning tea, lunch and drinks. They will be travelling to and from the carnival by bus. In order to ensure the safety of all children, a note is required for children to leave the grounds with someone other than a parent, and any children leaving the grounds with a parent must sign out with the class teacher.

To provide all of the activities planned we will require a large number of parent helpers. No experience is necessary in place judging or time keeping. We need your help. If you would like to help, please fill out the form which was sent with the permission note or contact the school office on 02 4724 3200.

In the interest of safety please list any medical conditions on the permission note which may affect your child's performance and the medication required, such as asthma puffers. All children need to return their permission note by Friday 22nd June 2018.

*Please note students in Year 2 who turn 7 this year **will not attend** this Athletics Carnival. They will remain at school with Kindergarten and Year 1 and will participate in the Infants Tabloid Carnival later this year.


Don't forget tomorrow night we have our first ever Mums and Sons night here in the hall from 5pm til 7pm!

Building Child Safe Communities - Forms For All Volunteers

'Building Child Safe Communities' is an initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering at schools. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <u>http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

If you would like to be a parent helper at sports carnivals, reading groups, gala days, excursions etc you will need to complete the form.

St Mary MacKillop has migrated to a new digital phone system which in turn means our phone number has changed. The new school phone number is **02 4724 3200**.




The old phone number is still in effect and will be for the next 12 months, however, when we call you the new contact phone number will be shown on your caller id.

Afternoon Pick Up

Please pick up all children at 3pm across the road in the park. Do not come into the playground to collect your child or take them from lines as this creates safety issues for our children.

The teacher on duty will bring any children who are not collected from the park by 3.05pm up to the school playground onto our waiters line. If a child is not collected by their parent across the road, please **DO NOT** keep the child waiting with you, they must return with the teacher on duty.

Changing After School Travel Arrangements

If you need to change the after school travel arrangements for your child on a permanent basis, could



you please forward a note to the classroom teacher.

If a change to after school travel arrangements is required after you have dropped your child at school, please contact the school office. Please be mindful that the office staff need to communicate this message to teachers and students and the process for this is to send a form to the child via the office bag which is collected from the office at **2pm**. We ask that you please, where possible, make these requests before **2pm** so that we can ensure the message reaches your child in a timely manner.

Skool Bag App Instructions

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).



We have received the following information from Busways:

Term 2 will see Busways continuing to look to your school for support in our efforts to enforce the use of Opal cards on our buses.

This term will see Busways Inspectors checking to ensure students are using their Opal cards when boarding the school bus. Students that do not present a valid Opal card will be asked to pay a fare. Failure to produce a valid Opal card or bus fare will result in the Inspector recording the student's name.

Below is an example of the form our Inspectors will use.

After the school inspection the names that were recorded will be emailed to the school, with a request for the school to follow-up with the students and parents/guardians concerned.

All students need to produce a •School Opal card •Child/Youth Opal card •Or pay a fare to travel on our buses.

Please explain to the students and parents involved that an Opal card is important because it is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't have an Opal card to tap on and off the service will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Calling for old Smartphones!

St Mary MacKillop will be trialling using Google Cardboard this year. Google Cardboard is a virtual reality (VR) platform developed by Google for use with a head mount for a smartphone. Named for its fold-out cardboard viewer, the platform is a low-cost system. The benefits of using VR in education include;



- Enabling students to learn about science, history, and geography in a much more immersive way
- Promoting curiosity and exploration by inviting students to go on impossible field trips in space or in history
- Taking students to places where they can't physically go.

As we are trialling Google Cardboard, we need smartphones to get them working. We are asking for any old smartphones that you would be willing to donate. The VR apps only require WIFI capability. SIM cards and personal data should be removed off your phone (this can be done by restoring factory settings). If you don't have a charger to go with the phone that's not a problem.
