Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop Primary School,

### Celebrating our Feast Day

On January 15, 1842 Mary MacKillop was born in Fitzroy, Victoria. Mary, the eldest of eight children, was well

educated by her father who spent some years studying for the priesthood in Rome. Unfortunately, Mary's father lacked financial awareness, so the family was often without a home of their own, depending on friends and relatives and frequently separated from one another. From the age of sixteen, Mary earned her living and greatly supported her family, as a governess, as a clerk, and as a teacher. While acting as a governess to her uncle's children at Penola, Mary met Father Julian Tenison Woods who needed help with the religious education of children in the outback. In1866, greatly inspired and encouraged by Father Woods, Mary opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable in Penola. Young women came to join Mary, and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph was begun. In 1867, Mary was asked by Bishop Shiel to come to Adelaide to start a school. From there, the Sisters spread, in groups to small outback settlements and large cities around Australia, New Zealand, and now in Peru, Brazil and refugee camps of Uganda and Thailand. Mary and these early Sisters, together with other Religious Orders and Lay Teachers of the time, had a profound influence on the forming of Catholic Education as we have come to know and experience it today. Throughout her life, Mary refused to attack those who wrongly accused her and undermined her work, but continued in the way she believed God was calling her and was always ready to forgive those who wronged her. Throughout her life Mary suffered ill health. She died on August 8, 1909 in the convent in Mount Street, North Sydney where her tomb is now enshrined. This great Australian woman inspired great dedication to God's work in the then new colonies. In today's world, she stands as an example of great courage and trust in her living out of God's loving and compassionate care of those in need. I would like to invite all parents and friends to join us in Our Feast Day Eucharistic Celebration at St Nicholas of Myra Church on Friday 8 August at 10:00am.

#### Let us Pray for Cardinal Edward Clancy

Cardinal Clancy, Sydney's seventh Archbishop, died early on Sunday at the Little Sisters of the Poor nursing home at Randwick where he had been receiving care for the past eight years. Bishop Peter Comensoli, the Archdiocese of Sydney Apostolic Administrator, said the news caused "great sadness." Father Brian Lucas, secretary of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference said, "He will be remembered not only by decisions such as the creation of the dioceses of Broken Bay and Parramatta but for his strong leadership in the beatification and eventual canonisation of Mary MacKillop" Father Frank Brennan remembered Cardinal Clancy as a candid man, "a fine church leader and a gentleman". Wollongong Bishop Peter Ingham, who worked under Cardinal Clancy for seven years, said he remembered, " A man of integrity, who was determined, even-handed, and who discharged his responsibilities conscientiously, in fact with an overwhelming sense of duty," Let us keep Cardinal Clancy in our prayers.
