THE LITTLE THINGS THAT MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

What is the key to success? According to the coach of a medal-winning Olympic cycling team, it is the accumulation of small gains. It's the little things that make the difference when winning might mean being better by only a fraction of a second.

The coach is so careful about small details that he even chooses the cyclists' mattresses because he believes they must have a very good night's sleep before a big race. Because the all-important thigh muscles of a cyclist can cool down and tighten up in the minutes waiting for a race to begin, his winning cyclists would wear special heated shorts that keep their muscles in peak condition. It is the small detail that makes the difference.

Of course, to do well in any field you must work hard on every aspect. Champion cyclists must be fit and strong, in peak physical condition, ready for competition after hours and hours of training, fully informed about tactics and strategy. But to stand out from the field what everyone needs is that attention to detail, the willingness to prepare so thoroughly you know you are doing the best you possibly can.

For students at St Mary MacKillop that may not mean a special mattress or heated shorts but it could mean making sure the children get enough exercise, sleep and good food. Then they would need to look carefully at every aspect of their work and concentrate on the details that will lift their performance. And doing that every day.

The lesson we learned from the inspiring athletes at the Olympics was not that they rely on natural talent to win the medal. Rather, we understood that behind every participant there lay hours and days and weeks and years of practice and that essential ingredient, attention to detail.



Feast of St Michael- 29 September

St Michael, who ranks among the seven archangels, is also one of the three angels mentioned by name in the Scriptures.

St Michael is spoken of four times in the Scriptures:

- The first reference occurs in Daniel (chapter 10) where Michael comes to comfort Daniel after he has had a vision, and promises to be his helper in all things.
- In Daniel (chapter 12), Michael is called "the great prince who stands for the children of Thy people".
 In these references, Michael is represented as Israel's great support during the 70 years of the Babylonian captivity.
- In the Letter of St Jude (verse 9), we are told that Michael disputed with Satan over the body of Moses.
- In the Book of Revelation (chapter 12), St John recounts his vision of the great battle in Heaven, when the wicked angels under Lucifer revolt against God, and how Michael, leading the faithful angels, defeats the hosts of evil and drives them out.

Because of the victory, St Michael is revered in Catholic tradition and liturgy as the protector of the Church, as once he was regarded as the protector of the Israelites. He is usually represented with a sword and banner. St Michael's feast day is 29 September.

Saint Michael, the Archangel,
Defend us in the hour of battle,
keep us safe from the wickedness and snares of the Devil,
May God restrain him, we humbly pray,
and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host,
By the power of God, cast Satan down into Hell,
and with him all the evil spirits
who wander through the world for the ruin of souls.

Labour Day Holiday - 4 October

The history of Labour Day in Australia spans over 150 years. It is an important annual event that commemorates the granting of the eight-hour working day for Australians and remembers those who struggled and succeeded to ensure decent and fair working conditions in Australia. During the mid to late 1800s the working day was long and arduous, where some employees would work up to 12 hours a day, six days a week. Many Australians saw the need for better working conditions and in the 1850s there was a strong push for this.

On 21 April 21 1856, stonemasons at the University of Melbourne marched to Parliament House to push for an eight-hour working day. An agreement with employers for a 48-hour week was eventually reached and Australian workers welcomed the new eight-hour day. A victory march was held on 12 May 1856 that year and each year after that. In 1856 the new work regulations were recognised in New South Wales, followed by Queensland in 1858 and South Australia in 1873. In 1874, Tasmania joined the other states in adopting the shorter eight-hour working day. In 1879 the Victorian Government made one further step towards better conditions for employees by proclaiming a paid public holiday that year. 
Praying The Rosary:

Traditionally the month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and this has been a tradition in the Catholic Church for a long time. Catholics pray the Rosary because it is a powerful prayer to God through His mother, Mary.

The word 'rosary' comes from Latin and means a garland of roses, the rose being one of the flowers used to symbolize the Virgin Mary. It is recognized as a truly biblical form of prayer - after all, the prayers that comprise it come mainly from the Bible.




