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Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop Primary School

IT'S A QUALITY CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Earlier this year all Staff, all students in year five and six, and sixty randomly chosen families completed the annual Quality Catholic School Survey. Below is a brief interpretation of the positive components of the St Mary MacKillop QCS survey for 2016.

Student Survey

Emotional Wellbeing

The student survey indicated that the children feel emotionally attached to the school and experience positive emotions at school such as enthusiasm and pride.

Teacher Relationships

The survey indicates that students feel that their teachers understand them and there is a balance of learning which is stimulating and well planned.

Engagement in Learning

At SMMK the survey indicates that students are motivated to learn,

Student Relationships

Students at SMMK are saying that Student Safety in the playground is higher in this domain.

Parent Survey

Community Engagement

Parents at SMMK feel that that school is focused on improvement and they are satisfied with the reporting.

Learning Opportunity

Parents feel the educational programs and standards of the school address the needs of their children and that their children are well prepared and supported during their transition to the next stage of their schooling,

Staff Engagement

Parents feel that teachers deliver classes, which are interesting and enjoyable for their child, and that teachers are passionate about what they do.

Student Engagement

Parents at SMMK see their children enjoying the learning they do at school and that their children want to go to school. Student motivation and connectedness to school was quite strong. **Peer Relations**

Parents at SMMK have rated Social Skills higher in this domain which can be an indication that parents feel that their children are developing a range of social skills

Student Behaviour

Parents of this school have rated Student Safety and Classroom Behaviour relatively equally. This is an indication that parents feel that their child is not being subjected to harassment or bullying at school and that behaviour in the classroom is not disrupting their child's ability to learn.

Staff Survey

Catholic Culture

Students, staff and parents at SMMK appear to place high importance on Catholic Identity and believe they have many opportunities to express their faith. Social Justice scored quite high in the St Mary MacKillop survey.

Wellbeing and Engagement

Staff communicated through the survey that they are energized and passionate when working together as a team.

Team Culture

The pattern in the engagement cluster at SMMK indicates an intrinsically motivated staff. This survey showed that the staff is intrinsically on board with the goals and objectives of the school and the "ownership" is self-motivated.

Staff Learning Culture

Professional Learning appears higher in this domain, which means that staff are learning through selfdirected learning activities, personal reading and attendance at external courses.

Teaching Climate

The staff survey indicated that there is effective coordination and opportunities for them to come together and work through how the curriculum is planned.

The staff expressed through the survey that the quality of teaching is a relative strength at this school and that they are building effective partnerships with the school's parent community.

The staff also feel that they engage students in effective learning and there is clear evidence of teachers' confidence in making a difference to students.

School improvement focus, ie the way that staff improves the way they carry out their work, is at a high level at SMMK.

Where to from here?

QCS provides us with data from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community and this assists us in focusing our efforts on improvement by building on our successes to date. We not only celebrate our successes, but also with the direction of the school improvement team (SIT) continue to investigate areas and strategies of improvement.

BE A GOOD SPORT

At St Mary MacKillop our school agreement highlights the importance of being a SAFE RESPECTFUL LEARNER. During your child's learning at St Mary MacKillop they will have the opportunity to represent the school in many areas, some of which include Sports Gala days. The Parramatta Diocesan Primary Schools Sports Council acknowledges the place sport plays in our students' daily lives. As parents and teachers we teach students the importance of respecting ourselves and respecting others. In sport it is important how the game is played and the manner in which our players, officials, parents and spectators conduct themselves.



We require all involved in our diocesan sporting activities to abide by the following Codes of Conduct, which are based on principles of 'The Australian Sports Commission Codes of Behaviour.'

I ask that you speak to your child about the following codes of conduct, which are relevant whenever children play any sporting activities.

Children

- Play by the rules at all times.
- Never argue with an official.
- Control my temper.
- Will not abuse officials or sledge other players.
- Work hard for themselves and their team.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays.
- Treat all participants in the sport, as I would like to be treated.
- Cooperate with the coach, my team-mates and opponents.
- Show quality sportsmanship by thanking officials and opposing team members at the end of games.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, abilities, cultural background or religion.

Parents

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than the final score.
- Encourage children to play according to the rules and to settle agreements without resorting to hostility and violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition
- Show appreciation for volunteer and employed coaches, officials and administrators.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performance and skilful play by ALL participants.
- Support all competitions by ensuring your child's attendance until the completion of their events.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, abilities, cultural background or religion.

Parents and children are required to adopt and practise the above Codes of Behaviour. The failure to adopt and practise the above mentioned Codes of Behaviour would result in the forfeiture of future representative opportunities.

Congratulations and thanks to all those children who continue to represent St Mary MacKillop with the highest of skill, expertise and code of conduct.

Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Monday 8th August

Mary MacKillop's Story 1842 - 1909

On January 15, 1842 Mary MacKillop was born of Scottish parents, Alexander MacKillop and Flora MacDonald in Fitzroy, Victoria. Mary, the eldest of eight children, was well educated by her father who spent some years studying for the priesthood in Rome but through ill health had returned to Scotland until 1835 when he migrated to Australia with his parents. Unfortunately, he lacked financial awareness, so the family was often without a home of their own, depending on friends and relatives and frequently separated from one another.



From the age of sixteen, Mary earned her living and greatly supported her family, as a governess, as a clerk for Sands and Kenny (now Sands and MacDougall), and as a teacher at the Portland school. While acting as a governess to her uncle's children at Penola, Mary met Father Julian Tenison Woods who, with a parish of 56,000 square kilometres, needed help in the religious education of children in the outback. At the time Mary's family depended on her income so she was not free to follow her dream. However, in 1866, greatly inspired and encouraged by Father Woods, Mary opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable in Penola.

Young women came to join Mary, and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph was begun. In 1867, Mary was asked by Bishop Shiel to come to Adelaide to start a school. From there, the Sisters spread, in groups to small outback settlements and large cities around Australia, New Zealand, and now in Peru, Brazil and refugee camps of Uganda and Thailand. Mary and these early Sisters, together with other Religious Orders and Lay Teachers of the time, had a profound influence on the forming of Catholic Education as we have come to know and experience it today. She also opened Orphanages, Providences to care for the homeless and destitute both young and old, and Refuges for ex-prisoners and ex-prostitutes who wished to make a fresh start in life.

Throughout her life, Mary met with opposition from people outside the Church and even from some of those within it. In the most difficult of times she consistently refused to attack those who wrongly accused her and undermined her work, but continued in the way she believed God was calling her and was always ready to forgive those who wronged her.

Throughout her life Mary suffered ill health. She died on August 8, 1909 in the convent in Mount Street, North Sydney where her tomb is now enshrined. Since then the Congregation has grown and now numbers about 900, working mainly in Australia and New Zealand but also scattered singly or in small groups around the world. The "Brown Joeys" may be seen in big city schools, on dusty bush tracks, in modern hospitals, in caravans, working with the "little ones" of God - the homeless, the new migrant, the Aboriginal, the lonely and the unwanted, in direct care and in advocacy, in standing with and in speaking with. In their endeavours to reverence the human dignity of others and to change unjust structures, the Sisters and those many others who also share the Mary MacKillop spirit continue the work which she began.

This great Australian woman inspired great dedication to God's work in the then new colonies. In today's world, she stands as an example of great courage and trust in her living out of God's loving and compassionate care of those in need. *(Extract from the Sisters of St Joseph)*

News from the Assistant Principal

Towards the end of last term, our teachers were introduced to an online Mathematics program called Matific. Our school was offered a 'free trial' period (which has been extended until the end of 2016) which provides teachers with the opportunity to explore the capabilities of Matific and how it can be utilised to support student learning at our school.

Students have been provided with log in details, and are able to access Matific both at school and at home. We can already see that most of our students accessed and engaged in Matific over the holidays and are continuing to do so. The feedback from both students and teachers so far has been overwhelmingly positive.

Matific offers engaging mathematical tasks that are linked with Australian Curriculum outcomes. More importantly. Matific aims to develop within students a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts (rather than rote learning) with sequenced lessons that build upon prior knowledge. Teachers are able to set designated homework tasks, personalised for each student or groups of students and teachers are able to monitor and track the success of those students completing the tasks. We believe that it will be a valuable online resource to support the teaching and learning happening at school. (At a much cheaper rate than Mathletics).

Currently, our students are able to access both online resources. (Years 3-6 Mathletics, K-6 Matific). We encourage the students (and parents) to continue to explore both resources and we will welcome further feedback from students and parents about both resources. An opportunity for parents to attend an 'information night' about Matific will be offered later in the year.
