



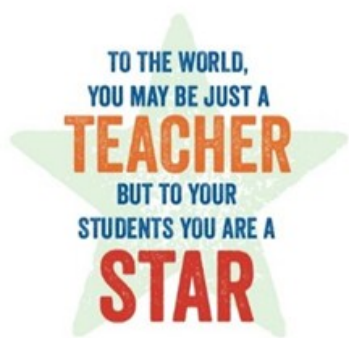
Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,

## Italian Classes at St Mary MacKillop???

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We have a wonderful opportunity to provide an additional extra-curricular opportunity for our students from 2018. The school has been approached by an organisation that provides after school tuition by professionally trained and accredited teachers in the Italian Language and they would like to use our school hall. I have included a brief outline on what they could offer us.

### **2018 Religious Literacy Assessment: Year 4 and Year 6**

During Term 3 all Year 4 and Year 6 students in the Parramatta Diocese completed an on-line assessment of their religious literacy development. This assessment required the students to answer a series of multiple choice questions related to their learning in Religious Education.



In addition, the Year 4 students completed a variety of learning tasks related to the Religious Education unit, Reconciliation: God's Forgiveness and Healing.

Religious Education in Catholic schools has always aimed to develop children's capacity to express their growing understanding, appreciation, thoughts, questions and insights into God, Jesus, the Scriptures, the Church, the Sacraments, Prayer and life as a Christian. This is essential to their participation in the religious life of the school, the parish and wider community.

The results of these assessments are now finalized and the students of St Mary MacKillop Primary performed exceptionally well. The average score for the Year 4 students was 72% which, is 5.1% above the diocesan average. In particular excellent results were achieved in the domains of: prayer, Jesus and church.

The average score for Year 6 was 74%, which is 6.6% above the diocesan average. In particular outstanding results were achieved in the domains of: Scripture, God, Jesus, Christian Life and Church.

There is much to celebrate in these results and together we will continue to build the students knowledge and understanding of their Catholic faith. Each student in Year 4 and Year 6 will receive an individual report, which will be sent home with their class report in Week 9.

### **World Mission Month**

**Socktober: 'Sock it to Poverty- Crazy Sock Day, Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> October'**



Last Tuesday, as the culmination of the students' religious education mission units, our school community celebrated World Mission Month by having a crazy sock day to raise money for Catholic Mission. Catholic Mission is a charity organisation which supports children who are vulnerable and in desperate need throughout the world.

This year the money raised, by all students in Catholic schools across Australia, will support the children in Uganda. Unfortunately, in areas of Uganda many children die each and every year due to poor medical facilities and preventable diseases.

As a school community we raised \$640 and on behalf of Catholic Mission, I thank you for your kind donations. If anyone has any further donations these can be forwarded to the school office.



### **Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November**

The Feast of All Saints is the day on which we celebrate all the saints, those known and unknown, who have died faithful to God and now share his life in heaven. Every day in the Church calendar honours a saint, but the Feast of All Saints is when the Church celebrates every saint. While we have information about many saints, and we honour them on specific days, there are many unknown or unsung saints, who may have been forgotten, or never been specifically honoured. On All Saints Day, we celebrate these saints of the Lord, and ask for their prayers and intercessions. All Saints is a common feast day in order to ensure that all saints, known and unknown, are properly honoured because they have shown us how to live a life devoted to God.

### **Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> November**



All Souls' Day is a solemn feast commemorating all of those who have died and are now in heaven with God. Churches have special liturgies and may invite the congregation to write the names of deceased friends or family members in a special book that would be placed on the altar at each mass during November.

### **Remembrance Day**

Saturday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, is Remembrance Day (also known as Poppy Day or Armistice Day). Remembrance Day is a solemn day observed since the end of World War I (1914 – 1918) to honour members of the armed forces who have died in the line of duty. Remembrance Day is observed on 11<sup>th</sup> November to recall the end of hostilities of World War I on that date in 1918. Hostilities formally ended "*at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.*" Each year we observe one minute silence at 11 am on the 11<sup>th</sup> November, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts.

The red remembrance poppy has become a familiar emblem of Remembrance Day due to the poem "In Flanders Fields". These poppies bloomed across some of the worst battlefields of Flanders in World War I, their brilliant red colour an appropriate symbol for the blood spilled in the war.

### **Why is Remembrance Day special to Australians?**

At 11 am on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in the war. This first modern world conflict had brought about the mobilisation of over 70 million people and left between 9 and 13 million dead, perhaps as many as one-third of them with no known grave. The allied nations chose this day and time for the commemoration of their war dead.

On the first anniversary of the armistice in 1919 two minutes' silence was instituted as part of the main commemorative ceremony at the new Cenotaph in London. The silence was proposed by Australian journalist Edward Honey, who was working in Fleet Street. At about the same time, a South African statesman made a similar proposal to the British Cabinet, which endorsed it. King George V personally requested all the people of the British Empire to suspend normal activities for two minutes on the hour of the armistice "which stayed the worldwide carnage of the four preceding years and marked the victory of Right and Freedom". The two minutes' silence was popularly adopted and it became a central feature of commemorations on Armistice Day.

On the second anniversary of the armistice in 1920 the commemoration was given added significance when it became a funeral, with the return of the remains of an unknown soldier from the battlefields of the Western Front. Unknown soldiers were interred with full military honours in Westminster Abbey in London and at the Arc de Triumph in Paris. The entombment in London attracted over one million people within a week to pay their respects at the Unknown Soldier's tomb. Most other allied nations adopted the tradition of entombing unknown soldiers over the following decade.

After the end of the Second World War, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day. Armistice Day was no longer an appropriate title for a day that would commemorate all war dead.

In Australia on the 75th anniversary of the armistice in 1993 Remembrance Day ceremonies again became the focus of national attention. The remains of an unknown Australian soldier, exhumed from a First World War military cemetery in France, were ceremonially entombed in the Memorial's Hall of Memory. Remembrance Day ceremonies were conducted simultaneously in towns and cities all over the country, culminating at the moment of burial at 11 am and coinciding with the traditional two minutes' silence. This ceremony, which touched a chord across the Australian nation, re-established Remembrance Day as a significant day of commemoration.

Four years later, in 1997, Governor-General Sir William Deane issued a proclamation formally declaring 11 November to be Remembrance Day, urging all Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11 am on 11<sup>th</sup> November each year to remember those who died or suffered for Australia's cause in all wars and armed conflicts.

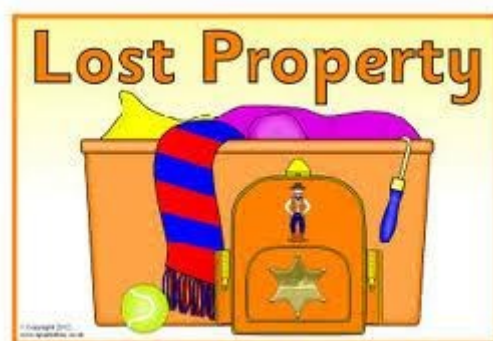

Parramatta Diocesan Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2018 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2017 and Term One in 2018. It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend.** To facilitate this, Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website [www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au](http://www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au) ~ Click on "REP SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the **SPORT** you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "PDCPSSC Expression of Interest Registration Form". **Each sport has a different registration criteria.**

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

**Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.**

**Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.**

**\$8.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for after school trials & \$10.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for half day and full day trials.**

**– This is to be paid upon registration at the trials once your child has been approved to attend the Parramatta Diocesan Trials.**

**Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union.**

**Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal.**

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.



# MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

## NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the N.S.W. P.S.S.A. Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

## SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selection in the NSW PSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students must be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSW PSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.

## A Message from Busways

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### School Opal Card – Help Us to Help You!

This message has been sent from Busways, the bus operator that provides your school bus services, regarding student use of the School Opal card.

An important requirement of School Opal card is the need for students to Tap On and Tap Off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due to the lack of recorded patronage.

With this in mind, we ask for your assistance in reminding your students that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card. This in turn helps us ensure we are able to provide the appropriate level of service to your students.

To further promote the use of School Opal, Busways will also be conducting checks on School Opal cards over the coming months. All students travelling on buses to and from school will be required to show their card and ensure they Tap On and Tap Off every time they catch the bus. Students without an Opal Card will be provided with a brochure to take home identifying how they can get an Opal Card.



Please support Busways staff with afternoon boarding and checks to ensure minimal delays to bus departure times and demonstrate a united front to students on bus travel and Opal Card use.
