Dear Parents,

As you would be aware, St Mary MacKillop Primary School has had a Professional Development focus on Mathematics since 2011, with the view to continually improve the learning outcomes of all our students in this area.

Led by the Catholic Education Department and supported by our Academic partner Dr Ann Gervasoni staff have been trained in the use of a special assessment tool called 'Mathematical Assessment Interview' (MAI). This is a one to one interview with a student, which takes approximately 30 minutes. The information gathered from this assessment is used to help teachers analyse the mathematical understanding of students across four domains in number – Counting, Place Value, Addition/Subtraction and Multiplication/Division. This information provides teachers with detailed analysis about children's number knowledge. Teachers are then able to provide more targeted learning opportunities to enhance student learning.

It is our intention that every student enrolled at St Mary MacKillop will have completed their interview at the beginning of the year. To assist staff in completing these interviews as early as possible in the new year, we are asking for students who would be available during our Staff Development Day on Tuesday 29 January 2019 from 12:30pm to 3pm, Wednesday 30 January from 9am to 4pm. We will also have availability on Wednesday of Week 2 (6th February) from 3:15pm to 4:15pm. Kindergarten 2019 students can book for MAI on Thursday 31 January between 9am and 3pm

Students need to be dropped off and picked up by parents or a designated adult either side of their allocated time. The MAI will be conducted by our teachers.

Our aim is to conduct this interview for as many students as possible in this time frame. This will not only provide staff with knowledge of individual students but data will then be analysed at the class, grade, school and Diocesan level and assist in the promotion of student growth in mathematical understanding.

If you are able to assist us in making your child/ren available for any of these times you will need to log onto:

- A booking confirmation screen will display, please check dates and times are correct and press FINISH
- When you click FINISH, your interview timetable will be emailed to you automatically. If you do not receive your
 email immediately Check your junk mail folder AND make sure you have entered your email address
 correctly. DO NOT DELETE the email you are sent. You may need to refer back to it.
- You can return to <u>www.schoolinterviews.com.au</u> at any time and change your interviews, via a link in the email that
 was sent to you, when you made your bookings until the bookings close on Tuesday 29 January at 9am


Our Book Fair has allowed us to purchase new resources to support teaching and learning at St Mary Mackillop, thank you to everyone for supporting this initiative.

Our Year 6 students recently visited an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the nation's capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics education rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection. The School Sport Australia Championships are held over numerous days that may include weekdend.

Please note the following information:

- The Diocesan trials, MacKillop trials and NSWPSSA Championships are held on school days.
- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This
 may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.
