Our community is very blessed to have such a welcoming and caring person as Fr Mathew leading us in our partnership of home, school and parish. I have always found Fr Mathew to be very generous with his time, keen to listen and genuinely interested in the staff, students and families of St Mary MacKillop. Therefore I feel it is appropriate to share with you that Fr Mathew will be celebrating his 60th birthday on 7th August. We will acknowledge this exciting milestone in some way on behalf of the community. However, if you see Fr Mathew at mass you may like to wish him a happy birthday.

In sadder news, the following was included in last week's parish bulletin.

Dear Parishioners, The La Salette Missionaries in India have in the Provincial Guidelines the condition that if a member, is a missionary in Australia for ten years or more, they may be called back to India to undertake another mission. As I am completing my 11 years here in Australia and my six year term as Parish Priest is also ending August 2018 my Provincial has decided I should return to India and undertake another mission and ministry. In view of this development I will be leaving for India in mid January 2019. Please keep me in your prayers as I prepare to embark on this journey. Fr Mathew.

Our time working together in this partnership will soon come to a close as Fr Mathew follows God's calling to minister to another community who will surely benefit from his wisdom, kindness and generosity. On behalf of our school community, I wish him all the very best on this next part of his journey.

Attendance Really Matters

At this time each year schools conduct a 'Census' which is collected by our school system and government agencies. As I prepare our census data for this year I had a close look at how we are going with getting kids to school regularly so that we can really challenge their unique gifts and talents.

One figure has troubled me enormously. At the end of Term Two we had **53 students** across our school with attendance lower than 90%. This means that they have missed at least 10 days of schooling (2 weeks) and learning that other children have received in our school and neighbouring schools.

If this trend continues to the end of the year they will miss 20 days of learning (4 weeks).

If it continues from Kindergarten to Year 6 they will miss 140 days of learning (28 weeks – almost a year).

If it continues from Kindergarten to Year 12 they will miss 260 days of learning (1 school year and almost half of another year).

The numbers certainly add up over time. To try to catch up this much learning is not a really achievable task. Can I ask for your support in also monitoring your child's attendance at school (whether here or another child at another school) and maximise their learning opportunities. Of course if children are sick we do not expect them to come to school but I wonder if they are too sick for school are they sick enough to see a doctor rather than just stay home?

Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Wednesday 8th August

Mary MacKillop's Story 1842 - 1909

On January 15, 1842 Mary MacKillop was born of Scottish parents, Alexander MacKillop and Flora MacDonald in Fitzroy, Victoria.

Mary, the eldest of eight children, was well educated by her father who spent some years studying for the priesthood in Rome but through ill health had returned to Scotland until 1835 when he migrated to Australia with his parents. Unfortunately, he lacked financial awareness, so the family was often without a home of their own, depending on friends and relatives and frequently separated from one another.



From the age of sixteen, Mary earned her living and greatly supported her family, as a

governess, as a clerk for Sands and Kenny (now Sands and MacDougall), and as a teacher at the Portland school. While acting as a governess to her uncle's children at Penola, Mary met Father Julian Tenison Woods who, with a parish of 56,000 square kilometres, needed help in the religious education of children in the outback. At the time Mary's family depended on her income so she was not free to follow her dream. However, in 1866, greatly inspired and encouraged by Father Woods, Mary opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable in Penola.

Young women came to join Mary, and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph was begun. In 1867, Mary was asked by Bishop Shiel to come to Adelaide to start a school. From there, the Sisters spread, in groups to small outback settlements and large cities around Australia, New Zealand, and now in Peru, Brazil and refugee camps of Uganda and Thailand. Mary and these early Sisters, together with other Religious Orders and Lay Teachers of the time, had a profound influence on the forming of Catholic Education as we have come to know and experience it today. She also opened Orphanages, Providences to care for the homeless and destitute both young and old, and Refuges for ex-prisoners and ex-prostitutes who wished to make a fresh start in life.

Throughout her life, Mary met with opposition from people outside the Church and even from some of those within it. In the most difficult of times she consistently refused to attack those who wrongly accused her and undermined her work, but continued in the way she believed God was calling her and was always ready to forgive those who wronged her.

Throughout her life Mary suffered ill health. She died on August 8, 1909 in the convent in Mount Street, North Sydney where her tomb is now enshrined. Since then the Congregation has grown and now numbers about 900, working mainly in Australia and New Zealand but also scattered singly or in small groups around the world. The "Brown Joeys" may be seen in big city schools, on dusty bush tracks, in modern hospitals, in caravans, working with the "little ones" of God - the homeless, the new migrant, the Aboriginal, the lonely and the unwanted, in direct care and in advocacy, in standing with and in speaking with. In their endeavours to reverence the human dignity of others and to change unjust structures, the Sisters and those many others who also share the Mary MacKillop spirit continue the work which she began.

This great Australian woman inspired great dedication to God's work in the then new colonies. In today's world, she stands as an example of great courage and trust in her living out of God's loving and compassionate care of those in need. *(Extract from the Sisters of St Joseph)*

Building Child Safe Communities - Forms For All Volunteers

'Building Child Safe Communities' is an initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering at schools. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <u>http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

If you would like to be a parent helper at sports carnivals, reading groups, gala days, excursions etc you will need to complete the form.

St Mary MacKillop has migrated to a new digital phone system which in turn means our phone number has changed. The new school phone number is **02 4724 3200**.




The old phone number is still in effect and will be for the next 12 months, however, when we call you the new contact phone number will be shown on your caller id.

Changing After School Travel Arrangements

If you need to change the after school travel arrangements for your child on a permanent basis, could

If a change to after school travel arrangements is required after you have dropped your child at school, please contact the school office. Please be mindful that the office staff need to communicate this message to teachers and students and the process for this is to send a form to the child via the office bag which is collected from the office at **2pm**. We ask that you please, where possible, make these requests before **2pm** so that we can ensure the message reaches your child in a timely manner.

Skool Bag App Instructions

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
