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Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,

Our school constantly strives to be:

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

There are many examples that I can share each fortnight of the outstanding work that the staff are undertaking to provide the very best education for your child. On this occasion I would like to focus on our school's involvement, as pioneers for the diocese, in developing the new Religious Education curriculum that will be adopted by all schools from next year. Every primary school in Australia must teach six KLA's (subjects) to pass school registration. When you chose a Catholic Education for your child, you also chose a seventh subject area, Religious Education for them.

As with all of our subjects, there must be a government approved course of study (a curriculum) with an accompanying set of guidelines for what is taught and when it is taught (a syllabus).

2018 saw the launch of a new Learning Framework for Religious Education in the Diocese of Parramatta. The Bishop's own motto 'Duc in Altum' (Go out into the deep) has provided the inspiration for this ambitious project. This new Learning Framework will be the basis of a new approach to Religious Education which will replace "Sharing Our Story" the current curriculum that has been in place for over 20 years.

The process of developing a new Learning Framework for Religious Education has been a co-creation with students, parents, teachers, clergy and system leaders. At the heart of the process was the commitment that the student wonderings about their faith would be the catalyst and the inspiration of the Learning Framework. The new approach is based on an experiential and inquiry based pedagogy and responds to learning elements of the Review of Religious Education that took place in 2014.

The draft Learning Framework for Religious Education is being trialled in Term 2 and our school has taken up the exciting opportunity to be a part of the trial in both of our **Year 1** classes this year. This will replace the current Sharing Our Story Program for Term 2. All St Mary MacKillop teachers will participate in a Professional Learning Program for the new Learning Framework throughout 2019 and will be well prepared for its implementation. This is an exciting opportunity for our community to further enhance our approach to Religious Education and promises to offer great learning for our staff and students.

I commend the hard work, creative thinking and innovative design that Miss Neilsen, Mrs Eisenhuth and Mrs Gillard are giving to this endeavour. They have worked tirelessly all year with specialists from our diocesan office and schools across our system to lead our whole community in this huge learning. It is not often that a new Religion Curriculum comes along and I am excited that our school is at the fore-front of building faith education for our kids today and into the future.

Facilities

Just a reminder that later this term we will commence a big project where we will remove the entire roof of the school and replace the old leaking tiles with new colourbond sheets of metal (like we have on the hall). I am in discussion with the builders at the moment to minimise disruption to our students and learning whilst carrying out this upgrade work.

Sacramental Program – First Holy Communion

The word 'communion' means to be united with; Catholics believe that in Holy Communion we are united in a special way with Jesus Christ.

At his Last Supper, Jesus said of the bread that he shared among his followers, "Take and eat, this is my body."

When we receive Holy Communion, Catholics believe that in a

mysterious way we are sharing in the body and blood of Christ. Holy Communion and the whole celebration is also known as Eucharist, from a Greek word meaning

thanksgiving. First Eucharist is a special occasion – a further step in becoming one with Christ and united with the people of God. For most people First Eucharist takes place at about the age of 9-10 years. Children should have an understanding of the sacrament that is appropriate to their age. Hopefully, this understanding will develop over the years. The church affirms that parents are the first educators of their children in the faith. You are handing on your faith to your children all the time. You have the wonderful responsibility of preparing your child to receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Usually the celebration of First Eucharist takes place at Sunday Mass. This is the most appropriate time. As the first reception of Eucharist marks a key step in the initiation of your child into the community of the church, it is most appropriate that the gathered community welcomes your child. The celebration of Mass is not just a special occasion for your family, but for the whole parish community.

Your child needs to feel at home in the parish community. Therefore, ideally, your child should receive First Eucharist at whichever Parish and Mass she or he usually attends.

This term our Social Justice Initiative will be based around supporting the St Vincent de Paul Winter Appeal and Penrith Community Kitchen. With winter upon us both these worthwhile charities are in need of our support.

Pentecost: Sunday 9th June

Sunday, the 9th June is the Feast of Pentecost, one of the most important days in the Christian Calendar. Pentecost is celebrated fifty days after Easter and concludes the Season of Easter.

The liturgical colour of Pentecost is red and this important day is considered the birthday of the Christian Church.
