Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,



Our school constantly strives to be:

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

As we approach the liturgical season of Advent, which commences on the 1st December, I encountered something this week which challenged me. Advent is a time of 'getting ready'. Getting ready to do something different in our lives having been inspired by the Nativity message of the birth of Christ.

As you know, in the nativity, Joseph returns to his home town of Bethlehem with his wife Mary (who is heavily pregnant). Upon his return home however, he discovers that there is nowhere to stay. Effectively, Joseph, his wife Mary and his expected new born child all find themselves homeless.

On Sunday I was speaking with a neighbour who volunteers in my local St Vincent de Paul Society chapter. He shared with me that 'Vinnies' NSW is really concerned with the current housing crisis in our state. They are actively seeking to draw State, Federal and Local governments into dialogue about doing more in action around this issue. At present, 'Vinnies' provides community housing to those in need through their provider, 'Amelie Housing' but the demand far outstrips the available housing. Some of the troubling facts I have learnt are:

- Less than 1% of rental properties are affordable to families and individuals on low incomes in Sydney.
- 50-60,000 people in NSW are waiting for social housing.
- Wait times for social housing exceed 10 years in most NSW cities.
- There has been an increase in homelessness of 37% since 2011. Almost 38 000 people in NSW now

I was able to take action this week by signing a petition of concern through my local St Vincent de Paul office. I have also made an appointment to see my State Member of Parliament to ask for more information about their policy and intention on this matter. Through these actions, I am starting my Advent a little early but I thought it might be a focus you could also consider as we move towards Christmas.

We had a magical celebration of our kids and their talents this week. Our Creative Arts Showcase 2019, brought to life our vision of 'Challenging students to develop their unique gifts and talents'. Thank you so much to massive number of people who came to support, encourage and enjoy the performances of our boys and girls.

I would also acknowledge and thank on your behalf the amazingly talented and generous staff of our school. Without their guidance and efforts, last night would not have been possible. Well done team.

The Season of Advent (Sunday 2nd December)

The Season of Advent, which begins this Sunday 2nd December, is a period of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Advent marks the beginning of the Church year and the liturgical readings change at the start of Advent from Year C to Year A as part of the church's three year cycle.

The Season of Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve. The colour of this season is purple. This is the colour of penitence as well as the colour of royalty to welcome the Advent of the King.

The word 'Advent' comes from Latin and means "coming;" its purpose is to look forward to the coming of Christ to Earth; it is a season that focuses on waiting. So, "Advent means something new is coming. This is really what the Christmas season is all about, isn't it? It's the celebration of the ADVENT of a new era. God broke into time and space and entered our world"

Through prayer, we can enter into God's world and ask Him to prepare our hearts the way He prepared all of history to receive the gift of His Son. During Advent we can try to cut away the distractions to make sure there's "room at the inn" of your heart this year.

Some Simple Things to Pray For During Advent:

- 1. Pray for attention to what truly matters, without being distracted by trivial things.
- 2. Pray for opportunities to learn something new regularly.
- 3. Pray for the grace to be able to rest, become aware of God's presence, and enjoy it.
- 4. Pray for strong relationships with other people in the community.
- 5. Pray for peace.
- 6. Pray for freedom from all that burdens you.
- 7. Pray for joy and a sense of humour.
- 8. Pray for confidence in God's love for you and trust in His power to work things out for the best in your life.
- 9. Pray for a genuine awareness of God's grace in your life and the humility to extend grace to others.
- 10. Pray for a passion to pursue justice.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in years 5 & 6 in 2020 be invited to attend**. To facilitate this, Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website <u>www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au</u> ~ Click on "REP SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "PDCPSSC Expression of Interest Registration Form". **Each sport has a different registration criteria.**

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2020 Paramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience"**.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

\$10.00 trialing fee is payable to your school if your child has been approved and confirmed to attend the Parramatta Diocesan Trials.



2020 Team Sport Trials Parramatta Diocese 2020 Information For Parents of current Year 4 and Year 5 students

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union. Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal. Discretion can be sought.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.

MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackilop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKilop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackilop team will compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selection in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Paramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.
