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Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,

Our school constantly strives to be:

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

Recently I have read some articles in our local press regarding class sizes at schools. These articles have provided a range of statistics but in my opinion not a lot of educational insight. The Executive Director of our diocese has published his view on the discussion around class sizes and I believe that it provides a more informed view from a teaching and learning perspective. I have included it below for your consideration.

Media reports about "overcrowded" classrooms get it all wrong. As a stand-alone solution for stronger schools, simply having smaller classes doesn't stack up. Wouldn't it be better to look at what really gets results and make that the priority?

An extraordinary amount of public funding has been directed towards decreasing student numbers since the Carr Government funded smaller Kindergarten classes. Yet NAPLAN results show schools with smaller classes haven't shot ahead of those with higher student-teacher ratios at all.

My own school days featured very large classes expertly (or otherwise) controlled by often rather authoritarian teachers. I'm not advocating a return to these arrangements or the fairly dictatorial teaching style that was all too commonplace! Technology provides so many opportunities to transform learning and teaching: changes to classroom structures are common sense.

Today, class sizes vary from system to system, and from school to school. Within any school, class sizes also vary from grade to grade and year to year based on enrolment demand and other relevant factors such as student needs. The pace of growth in some parts of Sydney sees new schools sprouting and established schools growing to make sure that enrolment needs are met.

Of course, providing extra support when class sizes are larger or individual student needs are higher is a must. This means that students in larger classes often have access to staff and extra resources. We also need to think differently around the way that staff work together, and work with students small class sizes sound alright, but they just don't deliver results on their own. It's great teaching, not small class sizes that make the most difference to student learning. There's no shame in higher studentteacher ratios, but there's plenty in failing to focus on what will really support learning: good teaching.

Over the past few weeks we have been advertising, interviewing and recruiting staff for the 2020 school year. We are blessed with so many talented teachers and a number of our teachers are at the early stages of their career journey. It is a pleasure to let you know that Miss Vella, Mr Martin, Miss Gillespie, Miss Nielsen and Miss Izzard will all be part of our team next year. With a number of our team taking leave to support their growing families, it is reassuring to know that the school community is well provided for by the quality of teachers that we have in our team.

We have invited Mrs Michelle Jarrett to join our staff in 2020. She is currently a member of St Patrick's Blacktown Community. We will also welcome Mrs Kaye Moore onto our teaching team in 2020. Mrs Moore joins us from the Corpus Christi, Cranebrook community. They bring a range of experiences, gifts and talents to our school and I look forward to introducing them to our community later in Term 4.

**Understanding:** The ability to comprehend that we are followers of Christ.


Counsel (Right Judgment): The ability to know right from wrong and to choose to do what is right.

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#### **Praying The Rosary**


Traditionally the month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and this has been a tradition in the Catholic Church for a long time. Catholics pray the Rosary because it is a powerful prayer to God through His mother, Mary.

The word 'rosary' comes from Latin and means a garland of roses, the rose being one of the flowers used to symbolize the Virgin Mary. It is recognized as a truly biblical form of prayer—after all, the prayers that comprise it come mainly from the Bible.

During the month of October there will be a school focus on the Rosary. The students in Years 3-6 will focus on learning and praying The Rosary during whole school prayer time at 2pm on a Friday afternoon.

Whilst we have Rosary beads at school the children are encouraged to bring in their own set of beads to personally enhance their prayer experience and to foster the prayerful practice in their own homes.
