Dear Parents and Friends of St Mary MacKillop School,

Our school constantly strives to be:

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

Earlier this term I had to share some confronting news with the staff team here at St Mary MacKillop and yesterday I shared it with our kindergarten families through a letter which was sent home. I have included the contents of the letter in this edition of the KIT so that our whole community is informed and able to give support at this challenging time.

"I am writing to you to ask for your support and understanding as our community enters a challenging time. One of our wonderful staff members, Miss Brittany Gillespie has been recently diagnosed with Stage 2 Ovarian Cancer and has begun the medical treatments recommended by her doctors. It is an enormously challenging time for Miss Gillespie and she is going to need all of

our love and support in the times ahead. Her treatment will require her to be absent from school on occasions and will likely require some adjustment to her role and workload as well. I know we can rely on your support in understanding why she won't always be the teacher standing at the front of your child's class. This understanding is a beautiful gift you give to Miss Gillespie so that she is not burdened by the stress of choosing between the children and her health.

We also understand that this will raise some questions for you as parents about how your child's needs at school will be met effectively. An outline of the school's plan on how we will continue to meet the learning needs of your child as well as their welfare needs will follow as another note from the school shortly.

In the spirit of promoting 'Safe, Respectful, Learners' our school supports staff to take leave when they are not well. Thank you for your support and understanding."

In planning with Miss Gillespie about how to let the staff, families and community know of the challenge she is facing, she has consistently asked me to be open in sharing information and grateful for the support she is receiving. However, we are aware that news such as this may affect others in broad and unexpected ways. We ask for your care and support for Miss Gillespie but also for those others in our community who are or have been impacted by illness and poor health.

First Week of Lent - Sunday 1st March

Around 2.8 million children in the Philippines do not go to school.

We begin Project Compassion learning about the story of Shirley from the Philippines. Shirley was struggling to support her family and keep her children in School. She faced regular discrimination and disadvantage, limiting her family's access to food, education, employment and healthcare. With Caritas Australia's support, Shirley trained to become an indigenous health worker. She has learnt to supplement her income and is able to feed her family. Second Week of Lent - Sunday 8th March

In Cambodia, 1 in 8 people live below the poverty line.

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Phany (pronounded Parn-ee). Struggling to earn a living as a farmer in Cambodia, Phany was forced to leave her daughter behind in the village to take up construction work in the city. Thankfully, through a Caritas funded program, Phany learnt new farming techniques which enabled her to get a better yield from her vegetable crops and to conserve water in her drought-stricken region. Phany's community also took part in training in health, nutrition, hygiene and disaster preparedness, arming them with better strategies to cope with environmental changes. The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term. If a student leaves the School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology may be charged to a student's account and are payable under the same conditions as Diocesan Fees.

A term's notice in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.

For iPhone and iPad users:


- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
