# Current Health advice for schools provided by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta:

#### Activities on hold until further notice

A small number of activities remain on hold and will be reconsidered during Term 3:

- Kindergarten orientation
- School camps
- Excursions (school incursions can occur)
- Interstate excursions
- International excursions (cancelled until further notice)
- Gathering of large groups of staff (from either one school or from multiple schools) for face to face conferences, all day professional learning activities, meetings or planning sessions.
- Parent and carer attendance at assemblies and other school events (schools may consider planning Year 12 graduation ceremonies adopting current restrictions and considering best and worst case scenarios or delaying until later in the year. Further advice will be issued if restrictions are relaxed later in the term)
- Parent and carer volunteers e.g. parent reading helpers (note: canteen and uniform shop volunteers are permitted)
- School-based activities that involve large gatherings of adults. These include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events.

Last Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> August the front St Mary MacKillop Primary School was decorated with balloons and banners to begin the celebration for the Feast of St Mary Mackillop, Australia's First Saint!



The students, dressed in mufti clothes, were greeted with hymns about Mary MacKillop that rung out over the loud-speakers and into the local community. At the front gate Mary MacKillop welcomed the children and collected their gold coin donations – this re-enacted what Mary and her fellow nuns did in the streets of Melbourne to raise money for their important work in helping the poor. Each year the school has a fundraiser as a response to Mary MacKillop's famous phrase of:

As a Josephite school we live by this powerful motto of St Mary MacKillop to, in small way, help the mission of Mary continue to flourish in our community today.

Year 3 learnt about Mary MacKillop's family, Year 4 investigated that Josephite emblem and Year 5 researched and completed a 'Mary - This Is Your Life' Quiz.

All students were asked to embrace their inner artist and an inaugural art competition was begun. The brief was simple - create an artwork that represents our Patron, Saint Mary MacKillop. Once all the artworks are completed, a winner from infants and primary will be announced.

Fr Joe, our Parish Priest, visited classrooms and spoke to the children about why St Mary MacKillop is so special to our school.

Our celebration concluded with every student receiving a treat from our wonderful P and F and the staff enjoying a special morning tea.

In honouring and celebrating our Patron Saint we aim to keep the memory of St Mary MacKillop alive in our community. 
