Semester Two Reports - Repeated from last KIT

The disruption to 'normality' for this community over the 5 months of remote learning and lockdown is well know to each one of us. It has been so refreshing to welcome our students back to face to face learning and the teachers are doing a fantastic job of checking student wellbeing, relationships and learning needs. It almost feels like a fresh start to the year and teachers are maximising every opportunity to return things to as close to normal as possible.

One challenge that we simply we cannot avoid however, is the composition of the Semester two reports on our children and their learning. In normal times, every teacher would be highly informed of what each child is able to demonstrate in independent learning achievement and effort across all 7 key learning areas. The would be able to exercise precision in identifying critical next steps for every student.

Whilst we acknowledge and honour the magnificent contribution that parents and families have made in keeping our kids learning going during lockdown, writing professional summative reports for all 7 KLA's on our children is proving enormously problematic for our teachers. Without the valuable information that is collected each and every day in our classrooms across all subjects, our teachers are extremely limited in what they will be able to professionally report on for this semester. It is presenting as a thirteen week 'hole' in their normal precise and professional judgement. Rather than return our students to a model of intense assessment and testing, we have taken the position as a staff that we will take advantage of every day left available to us to maximise the teaching and learning.

I therefore need you to make aware that the 2021 Semester Two Reports for our school will be very different to other years. This year our report will consist of:

- A cover page which is the same as previously used
- A letter from CEDP regarding Semester Two Reports

• For Religious Education, there will be a Statement of Teaching outlining what the grade has been taught in Semester Two. A table indication your child's level of engagement in this subject.

Two comments that describe some aspect of the learning your child has demonstrated in this subject during the semester.

• For English there will be a Statement of Teaching outlining what the grade has been taught in Semester Two. A table indicating your child's level of engagement in this subject. Three comments that describe some aspects of the learning your child has demonstrated in this subject during the semester.

• For Mathematics there will be a Statement of Teaching outlining what the grade has been taught in Semester Two. A table indicating your child's level of engagement in this subject. Three comments that describe some aspects of the learning your child has demonstrated in this subject during the semester.

• On the back page, there will be a table indicating the 'Personal and Learning Traits' that your child has demonstrated since returning to face-to-face learning.

• On the back page will also be a table indicating your child's attendance in Semester Two.

On behalf of the teachers, I thank you in advance for your understanding and support as we navigate this challenge together.

The Season of Advent (Sunday 28th November)

The Season of Advent, which begins on Sunday 28th November, is a period of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Advent marks the beginning of the Church year

and the liturgical readings change at the start of Advent from Year B to Year C as part of the church's three-year cycle.

The Season of Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve. The colour of this season is purple. This is the colour of penitence as well as the colour of royalty to welcome the Advent of the King.

The word 'Advent' comes from Latin and means "coming." Its purpose is to look forward to the coming of Christ to Earth; it is a season that focuses on waiting and preparing.

Here are some ways to wait and prepare during Advent:

Get or make an Advent wreath - Lighting the candles, one each week, is a way of counting down the time until Christmas. It is also a good way to signal that we are entering a very special time.

Set up a nativity scene - Displaying a nativity scene (or manger set) in your home during Advent is a great way to remind everyone about the true meaning of Christmas.

Keep an Advent calendar - Marking off the days of Advent is a good way to count down to the birth of Jesus.

Pray

Through prayer, we can enter into God's world and ask Him to prepare our hearts the way He prepared all of history to receive the gift of His Son. During Advent we can try to cut away the distractions to make sure there's "room at the inn" of your heart this year.

Some things to pray for during Advent:

1. Pray for attention to what truly matters, without being distracted by trivial things.

2. Pray for opportunities to learn something new regularly.

3. Pray for the grace to be able to rest, become aware of God's presence, and enjoy it.

4. Pray for strong relationships with other people in the community.

5. Pray for peace.

6. Pray for freedom from all that burdens you.

7. Pray for joy and a sense of humour.

8. Pray for confidence in God's love for you and trust in His power to work things out for the best in your life.

9. Pray for a genuine awareness of God's grace in your life and the humility to extend grace to others.

10. Pray for a passion to pursue justice.

School Fees

Leaving Families

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child (<u>Kindergarten-Year 5</u>) will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.


P & F NEWS


