# Religious Education News

### **New Religious Education Curriculum - Formation Dispositions**

The new Religious Education curriculum comprises 28 learning cycles for primary schools and each grade will complete 4 learning cycles over the year. The learning cycles are based on an inquiry approach which emphasises the student's role in the learning process – they are encouraged to explore, ask questions and share ideas.

The essence of the curriculum are the Formation Dispositions which are:

<u>Head (cognition/intelligence)</u>- Be Attentive; Be Intelligent; Be Reasonable; Be Responsible <u>Heart (affectivity/emotions)</u> - Be Contemplative; Be Empathetic; Be Humble; Be Loving <u>Hands (action/how we live our life)</u> - Be Present; Be Active; Be Compassionate; Be Effective

The term 'Dispositions' are understood as a movement of the heart towards love of God and love of neighbour. 'He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." (Mt. 22: 34-40).

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The head, heart and hand methodology is used across all the learning cycles from Kindergarten to Year 6. In Term 2, all of the grades at St Mary MacKillop will be engaging with a Learning Cycle (unit of work) from the Draft New Curriculum.

Grade	Religious Education Learning Cycle
Kindergarten	Who is my neighbour? Diocesan Cross Country
Year 1	What is prayer?
Year 2	How can I show love towards my neighbour?
Year 3	How is God present in my life?
Year 4	Why are people hungry in a world full of plenty?
Year 5	What is my existential purpose in life?
Year 6	What is human dignity?

# Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
