2021 NAPLAN

This week our students in Year 3 and Year 5 are participating in the National Assessment Program Literacy And Numeracy (NAPLAN).

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school. Teachers have ensured that students are familiar with test formats prior to NAPLAN tests.

It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. Your child's school is your first point of contact for questions about NAPLAN.

Schools in all states and territories are moving from paper tests to online tests. All schools are expected to transition to NAPLAN Online by 2022. St Mary MacKillop students will complete all NAPLAN assessments, with the exception of Year 3 Writing, Online this year.

Online assessment will provide more precise results and has been shown to result in better engagement from students with tailored testing.

New Religious Education Curriculum - Formation Dispositions

In the last KIT I introduced the Formation Dispositions - Head, Heart and Hand - which are the essence of the new curriculum. These dispositions are known as the 3H Paradigm (model or pattern)

A strong faith is a healthy balance of head, heart and hand and this week I would like to unpack the first disposition which is the Head.

The Head refers to our cognition and intelligence......it leads to a thinking faith and is guiding us to:

Be Attentive - to what is happening around us

Be Intelligent - our cognition and head space

Be Reasonable - our thinking ability - Are we reasonable or unreasonable in our position?

Be Responsible - are we taking responsibility for the tasks we have been set and for the people around us?



Pentecost: Sunday 23rd May

School Fees

Instalment 2 School Fees have now been issued and mailed to your home/billing address. If you have not received your statement, please make contact with the school office. Instalment 2 School Fees are due Wednesday, 26th May 2021.

School Office hours are 8:30am – 3:30pm. All payments and enquiries can be made during this time. Payments through the office can be paid by EFTPOS. When paying by BPay, Bpoint & Post BillPay please use the current statement. Details are located on the bottom of the statement.

We advise that we are unable to process EFTPOS payments after 3:30pm.

Leaving Students

The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term.

If a student leaves the School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology may be charged to a student's account and are payable under the same conditions as Diocesan Fees. A term's notice in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.
