#### 2021 TTFM Survey

Dear Parents and Carers,

St Mary MacKillop School, greatly values feedback from our community to help us provide the best possible environment for our students to learn and grow. To help us do this, we will be participating in the Tell Them From Me (TTFM) online survey for students, teachers, parents and carers. The survey will provide us with valuable insights into what our school community thinks about school life including how engaged students are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world use the Tell Them From Me survey to help them improve.

Between 31 May and 25 June 2021, all students will be given the opportunity and time to participate in this survey during regular school hours. Students who agree to complete the survey will be given a random username and password to access and complete the survey online. Students' names cannot be linked to their responses which allows it to be completely anonymous. Results will show all student scores combined together – it is not possible to single out individual students in the results. Parents and carers will be able to participate using a link we will send to you separately in coming weeks.

The survey takes approximately 25 to 30 minutes to complete. The survey measures include wellbeing, physical health, and behaviours and attitudes linked to student success. Participation in the survey is entirely voluntary. You or your child/children need not take part if either of you do not wish to. If during the survey participants feel uncomfortable answering any question, it can be left blank or they can stop the survey completely at any time.

#### **Facilities Update**

During the last school holidays, we had a team of electricians work in the school to upgrade all of our electrical distribution boards. This work has then allowed us to move forward in replacing every light fitting in the school. This week we have completed just over half of this work thanks to a team working on site each night to remove light fittings and replace them with new energy saving LED lights. We anticipate the whole project will be completed in early July.

Then in the upcoming holidays, the Year1 and 2 classrooms will be painted as well as the hall. Work will then move to the administration block in the school. ## Religious Education News

New Religious Education Curriculum - Formation Dispositions

The new Religious Education Curriculum fosters a strong, healthy faith by promoting a balance of head, heart and hand understanding. In the last KIT we looked at the dispositions of the head and this week I would like to unpack the heart.

The heart refers to our affectivity, emotions and feelings and is guiding us to: Be Contemplative – to reflect and discern on actions

Be Empathetic - to put ourselves in somebody else's shoes or place

Be Humble - to understand that we don't know everything

Be Loving - to be caring and considerate of those around us

#### Sacramental Program - First Holy Communion

The word 'communion' means to be united with; Catholics believe that in Holy Communion we are united in a special way with Jesus Christ.

At his Last Supper, Jesus said of the bread that he shared among his followers, "Take and eat, this is my body." When we receive Holy Communion, Catholics believe that in a

mysterious way we are sharing in the body and blood of Christ. Holy Communion and the whole celebration is also known as Eucharist, from a Greek word meaning thanksgiving.

First Eucharist is a special occasion – a further step in becoming one with Christ and united with the people of God. For most people First Eucharist takes place at about the age of 9-10 years. Children should have an understanding of the sacrament that is appropriate to their age. Hopefully, this understanding will develop over the years. The church affirms that parents are the first educators of their children in the faith. You are handing on your faith to your children all the time. You have the wonderful responsibility of preparing your child to receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Usually the celebration of First Eucharist takes place at Sunday Mass. This is the most appropriate time. As the first reception of Eucharist marks a key step in the initiation of your child into the community of the church, it is most appropriate that the gathered community welcomes your child. The celebration of Mass is not just a special occasion for your family, but for the whole parish community.

Your child needs to feel at home in the parish community. Therefore, ideally, your child should receive First Eucharist at whichever Parish and Mass she or he usually attends.

### Office News

#### **School Fees**

Instalment 2 School Fees are now overdue. If you already have paid your fees, thank you. All overdue school fees should now be paid or under an arrangement.

School Office hours are 8:30am – 3:30pm. All payments and enquiries can be made during this time. Payments through the office can be paid by EFTPOS only. When paying by BPay, Bpoint please use the current statement. Details are located on the bottom of the statement.

We will be going cashless for school fees as from the start of Term 3. Therefore we ask that if you would like to pay cash for the school fees that you visit your local Australia Post and use the Post BillPay on the bottom or your statement.

We advise that we are unable to process EFTPOS payments after 3:30pm.

#### **Leaving Students**

The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term.

If a student leaves the School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology may be charged to a student's account and are payable under the same conditions as Diocesan Fees. A term's notice in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

# Kindergarten Science Incursion


