Whole School Easter Celebration - 9:15am Thursday 6th April

This year to celebrate Easter, the most important liturgical season of the church year, the St Mary MacKillop community will focus on the last week of Jesus' life as the students re-enact the events of Holy Week. Each grade will present a certain event from Holy Week.

Palm Sunday - Kindergarten Jesus cleansing the temple - Year 1 Holy Thursday - The Last Supper and Washing of the Feet- Year 4 Agony in the Garden- Year 2 Jesus is arrested and Peter denies Jesus- Year 3 Jesus' trial, carrying the cross and Good Friday - Year 5 After the holidays Easter Sunday and The road to Emmaus - Year 6

Please join us in the hall on Thursday 6th April at 9:15am for our celebration of Easter.



Holy Week is the last week of Lent and during this week we remember how much Jesus loves us. Whatever we do, no matter how busy or "distracted" we might be, we cannot let the power of this week be in the background of our thoughts. Jesus entered into our life so that we never experience joys and heartbreaking sadness alone.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday (2nd April) and concludes with Easter Sunday (9th April). It recalls the last week in the life of Jesus Christ. The sacred events of Holy Week are:



Palm Sunday (2nd April) - Commemorates the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem that was marked by the crowds who were in Jerusalem for Passover waving palm branches and proclaiming him as the king. This Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday to commemorate Jesus' final agonizing journey to the cross.

Holy Thursday (6th April) - There are a variety of events that are clustered on this last day before Jesus was arrested. These include Jesus and the disciples last meal together, the institution of the Eucharist, the washing of the feet, the betrayal by Judas and Jesus praying in Gethsemane while the disciples fell asleep.




Good Friday (7th April) - On this day, we remember Jesus' arrest, his trial, crucifixion and suffering, death, and burial. Since services on this day are to observe Jesus' death, and since Eucharist is a celebration, there is traditionally no Communion observed on Good Friday.



Easter Sunday (9th April) – On Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, Jesus Christ who was raised from the dead, three days after his death on the cross. Through his death, burial, and resurrection, Jesus gives all who believe in him eternal life.

As you celebrate this Holy Week, I wish everyone a happy, safe and holy Easter.

SMMP Thinking Mathematically!

DOUBLING and NEAR DOUBLING

The doubling math facts is a great strategy to increase speed and accuracy for even the most difficult facts.

Doubles facts teach students to manipulate numbers. This is a key strategy for future success in mathematics. Kids are learning how numbers relate to each other and this provides a foundation for using effective strategies for solving other number sentences.

For example, 5 + 6 = 5 + 5 + 1. Most young students do not understand that both sides of the equation have the same sum (value). They do not instinctively recognise this. By pointing out the doubles fact, you are not only explicitly teaching a strategy for solving 5 + 6. You are also laying the foundation for success with automaticity.

Doubling works with large numbers as well, *i.e.* 50 + 60. It is best utilized when the addends are relatively close together or can be deconstructed into an equation that makes sense (50 + 50 + 10).

This is a Middle Years EMU activity using doubles as a strategy to help problem solve.

This game is called 'Throw Down Sticks'. Students have to throw down the sticks and add the value on each stick together. First, the tens were grouped together, however, the students didn't know what 4 times 6 was off the top of their head, so they had to break it down. They used doubles facts about 6 to solve half of the problem, then doubled 12. All they needed to do then was add the two totals together.

In **EMU** they also use doubles facts to help justify where to plot numbers on a number line. They play a game called 'Three in a Row'. In this game, the students take turns plotting numbers on a measuring tape and then use reasoning skills to plot these numbers on an empty number line. The doubles facts helped them work out where halfway is.



PROGRESSION OF LEARNING

What does doubling look like for Year 1 students?

- Students use doubles and near doubles, eg 5 + 7: double 5 and add 2

What does doubling look like for Year 3 students?

- Student relate 'doubling' to multiplication facts for multiples of two, eg 'Double three is six'
- Make connections between doubling (x2) and then doubling again (x4)
- 32 x 4 = 128 double 32 = 64 (x 2) double 64 = 128 (x 4)

What does doubling look like for Year 5/6 students?

- Students solve word problems involving multiplication and division i.e doubling/halving quantities in a recipe
- Apply doubling to fractions and decimals

School Fees

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for **more than 5 school days**. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and are to be completed **prior** to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.

Library News

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

The PRC is open for all NSW students in Kindergarten to Year 9, in government, independent, Catholic and home schools.

Kindergarten students at SMMK are registered and will participate in the challenge at school. Parents do not need to log the books for Kinder students, this will be done by Mrs Eisenhuth using the books they have experienced as part of their learning at school.

The challenge requires children to read a certain number of books depending on their age. After books are read (or 'read to' for Kindergarten to Year 2 children) you or your child will need to enter the books on the PRC website using the child's unique log in code at https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html . Students in Yrs 1-6 will receive their login code from their classroom teacher. Please also refer to this website, click on the tabs for the rules of this challenge and the 'Book lists'.


