Afternoon Dismissal Procedures

Dear parents and caregivers,

Just a few friendly reminders about our afternoon dismissal procedures that are in place to ensure a smooth, timely and safe dismissal for all our students and teachers. Your help in following these procedures is greatly appreciated.

- Parents are kindly asked to keep the bottom gate clear so that teachers can
 walk classes out to the park and load the buses. Congestion at the gate makes
 afternoon dismissal very unsafe.
- All students on 'walkers' can be picked up in the park at 3pm. Any child left in the park after 3:10pm will be brought back to school by the teacher on duty and placed on 'waiters'.
- The top gate (near the office), must also remain clear. This allows the classes to exit the school safely and the teachers to move the bus children to the buses.
- Children on waiters can be picked up at 3:10pm. No parent should be at the top gate until 3:10pm.
- If you need to pick up your child before 3:10 pm please send them to 'walkers' and meet them in the park.

The Season of Lent

The Season of Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday (22nd Feb) is a 40 day liturgical season of the church. The colour of lent is purple and it is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (sharing what we have with the poor).

The 40 days of lent provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon our lives, to pray more deeply, experience sorrow for what we have done and failed to do, and to come back to God with a change of heart.

It is a time to nurture our relationship with God and seek the meaning of Jesus' selfless love, so

that we might reflect that love to others.





<u>First Week of Lent</u> (Week beginning Sunday 26th February)

Laxmi from Nepal

We begin our annual Lenten Project Compassion journey by learning about Laxmi, a 16-year-old girl living in Jajarkot, a remote district in Nepal where almost half of the population live below the poverty line. Tragedy struck when Laxmi was 10 years old and her father passed away. Her father worked hard to pay for his children's education and, after losing him, Laxmi was at risk of falling further into extreme poverty.



With the support of our partner Caritas Nepal, Laxmi joined a child's club at her school where she was encouraged to resume her education. Through the child's club, Laxmi developed the skills and confidence to become a leader, advocating for clean water taps at her school.

Laxmi is now excelling in her studies and working towards her dream of becoming a civil engineer. She continues to be involved in the child's club, serving as an advisor and mentoring the next generation of young leaders at her old school. Watch a short film about Laxmi's story here.

Second Week of Lent (Week beginning Sunday 5th March)

Tereesa from Western Sydney

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Tereesa, a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children. Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Through Baabayn, Tereesa

was also able to hear stories from Indigenous Elders and reconnect with her culture.

Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

This money will be forwarded to Caritas Australia, the Catholic Agency for International Aid and Development so that they can continue to work with local communities around the world to end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity.

Catholic Schools Week: 5th-11th March

Catholic Schools Week (CSW) is an annual event and involves the communities of all 591 Catholic primary and secondary schools across NSW and the ACT. First and foremost, Catholic Schools Week is about celebration and the theme this year is "Our teachers make the difference". The main aim of CSW is to raise awareness and celebrate the strength and distinctiveness of Catholic schools across the State. CSW will provide an opportunity for Catholic schools to showcase what is done every day in our schools and invite the community in to experience teaching and learning at its best. Catholic Schools Week is about strengthening relationships between all those that have a stake in our schools – students, staff, families, priests, parishioners, and members of the wider community.

To celebrate Catholic School Week at St Mary MacKillop we will have a Liturgy of the Word at 9:15am on Thursday 9th March. This liturgy will be facilitated by Year 4 and all in our community are warmly invited to attend to celebrate our faith together. Following the CSW liturgy we will have open classrooms.



As many of our Stage 3 students begin preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, it is an opportune time to reflect on our understanding of this sacrament.

The sacrament of Confirmation builds on the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion and completes the process of initiation into the Catholic community. It establishes young adults as full members of the faith. This sacrament is called *Confirmation* because the faith given in Baptism is now confirmed and made strong. During Baptism, parents and godparents make promises to believe in God and the Church on a child's behalf. At Confirmation, the candidates renew those same promises, this time speaking for themselves.

During Confirmation, the focus is on the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles at Pentecost and gave them courage to practice their faith. Catholics believe that the same Holy Spirit confirms during the Sacrament of Confirmation and gives them the same gifts. The seven *gifts* of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, right judgment, courage, knowledge, reverence and awe.

A bishop (or his representative) celebrates the Sacrament of Confirmation, because each bishop is a successor to the Apostles, upon whom the Holy Spirit descended at Pentecost—the first Confirmation. The bishop wears red vestments to symbolize the red tongues of fire seen hovering over the heads of the apostles at Pentecost.

Confirmation is administered by the laying on of hands, which signifies the descent of the Holy Spirit, and the anointing of the confirmation candidate with chrism (an aromatic oil that has been consecrated by a bishop). At the time of anointing the bishop will say "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." This seal is a consecration, representing the safekeeping by the Holy Spirit of the graces bestowed on the Christian at Baptism.

All baptized persons can be confirmed. The effect of the Sacrament of Confirmation is to give strength in faith.

School Fees

Instalment 1 School Fees are due Wednesday, 15th March 2023. If you already have paid your fees or set up an arrangement, thank you.

If you are having any difficulties in paying your school fees please contact our Senior Finance Officer, Mrs Monique Kearins on 4724 3200 to discuss.

School Office hours are 8:30am – 3:30pm. All payments and enquiries can be made during this time. Payments through the office can be paid by **EFTPOS**. When paying by BPay, Bpoint & Post BillPay please use the current statement. Details are located on the bottom of the statement.

We advise that we are unable to process EFTPOS payments after 3:30pm.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form.

These forms are to be completed prior to your holiday. If you are taking your child on leave for more than 5 days a copy of your travel itinerary is required with the application. The school principal can only approve up to 50 school days leave. Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.
