St Mary MacKillop Bullying Policy (Pastoral Care Policy)

Our school Mission Statement and our Pastoral Care Policy underpin our whole school commitment to providing a safe and supportive environment.

Staff and students are aware that bullying behaviour is never acceptable. Incidences of bullying behaviour are dealt with in line with Diocesan Policy.

Our school climate fosters a sense of belonging and empowerment through:

- Promoting positive interpersonal relationships
- Protective behaviours programs
- Clear and consistent student management procedures.

Bullying is the act of oppressing people less powerful than ourselves, for example, inflicting physical violence, using verbal ridicule, exclusion and rumour mongering.

Most bullying is psychological and not physical. It is intentional, often continues over lengthy periods of time and usually unprovoked.

Staff at St Mary MacKillop are committed to take the problem of bullying seriously and to try to eliminate it in the school.

Year 1 Excursion

On the 24th May Year 1 travelled to Lizard Log in Western Sydney Parklands to learn all about features of people and places. Students enjoyed a variety of hands on activities to help explore their thinking.

Students started the day with an introduction to native animals that we would find in Australia. From here students then explored how we can stop water pollution and the impact it has on sea life. Afterwards students built habitats in groups out of what they could find in the natural environment. These habitats were for the native animals the students met at the beginning of the day. Students thoroughly enjoyed this part as they could be as creative as they wanted. The day continued with bug catching and bird house making. Both of these tasks challenged students to be observant and creative in their designs of the bird house.

The playground that students got to play on at lunch time was definitely a high light as it had a zip line where students raced each other. Overall year 1 had an excellent day at Lizard Log.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for **more than 5 school days**. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and must be completed **prior** to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.


