<u>The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u> Friday September 8th



The Feast of the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary has been celebrated in the Church since about the 6th Century. This is one of only three birthdays celebrated in the Church Calendar:

- the Birth of Jesus (December 25)
- the Birth of John the Baptist (June 24); and
- the Birthday of Mary, the mother of Jesus (September 8^{th})

The birth of Mary was miraculous. She was conceived without sin as a special grace because God had selected her to become the mother of His Son. There is nothing contained in Scripture about the birth of Mary, though the apocryphal "Gospel of James" (a book dating from the 2nd Century AD and not part of the authentic canon of Scripture – the Bible as we know it today) fills in the gaps. According to this account, Mary's parents were Joachim and Anne. They were old and beyond the years of having children, but prayed to God that He would grant their longing for a child – which He did.

In celebrating the nativity of Mary, Christians anticipate the Incarnation and birth of her Divine Son, and give honour to the mother of Our Lord and Saviour.

The feast of the Virgin Mary's birth marks a great day in the history of the world, as it was a vital step in the coming of the Jesus. Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth offers the greatest possible happiness to the world.

Impart to your servants, we pray, O Lord, the gift of heavenly grace, that the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin may bring deeper peace to those for whom the birth of her Son was the dawning of salvation. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever. Amen

2023 Sacramental Program - The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (commonly called Confession, Reconciliation, the Sacrament of Healing or Penance) is one of seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. Penance is a sacrament instituted by Christ in which forgiveness of sins

(wrong choices) committed after Baptism is granted through the priest's absolution to those who with true sorrow confess their sins and promise to try to do better in the future. It is called a "sacrament" not simply a ceremony, because it is an outward sign instituted by Christ to impart grace to the soul.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of the most unique aspects of Catholicism. Jesus Christ, in His abundant love and mercy, established the Sacrament of Confession, so that we as sinners can obtain forgiveness for our sins and reconcile with God and the Church. The Sacrament "washes us clean," and renews us in Christ.

"Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained' " (John 20:21-23)

EARTHCARE:

The Faith in Action Team have been learning about how St Mary MacKillop Primary School can begin the journey to becoming a Catholic Earthcare School. Catholic Earthcare Australia is a program of Caritas Australia that responds to the 'cry of the earth' and 'the cry of the poor' working to safeguard the integrity of creation. This program will help us at St Mary MacKillop to make simple, positive changes to care for our world.

To begin our journey, the students will participate in a Mini Earth Hour event during the Whole School Prayer time on Friday before assembly. We ask that you participate in the event at home too sometime before Monday 11th September. Here are the steps for the event:

- 1. Turn off all electric devices.
- 2. Participate in the Earthcare prayer from the poster.
- 3. Write #MackillopEarthHour on a piece of paper and draw/write different ways we can look after the Earth.
- 4. Spend some time with your family away from technology. Spend some time at the park, play outside, have a picnic etc.
- 5. After the Earth Hour, take a photo of your family holding the sign you made and email it to the school office. stmarymackillop@parra.catholic.edu.au

All of the images will be collected and made into a presentation to show that our school community wants to make a change to look after our common home: The Earth. It will also be a great first step towards our journey to become an Earthcare School.

QKR App

It is important that when you are using the QKR App that you have selected the correct class for your child.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. **One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.**

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for **more than 5 school days**. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and must be completed **prior** to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.


