Learning Improvement Focus for 2024

Whilst we are constantly updating our practice and improving our knowledge as a staff and a school, in 2024 we have a particular focus in Mathematics. These documents direct what we teach, when we teach it and suggestions on what the teaching could look like. Therefore our teaching will adapt to these new guidelines. 
A Lenten Prayer to Know God More

The Season of Lent

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday. The 40 days of Lent correspond to the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness to fast, pray, and endure temptations, all in preparation for his public ministry which would culminate in his death on the cross.

The Season of Lent offers us an opportunity to deepen the meaning and value of our Christian lives, and it encourages us to rediscover the mercy of God so that we, in turn, become more merciful towards others.

The three pivotal practices of Lent are:

- Fasting (self denial)
- Prayer
- Almsgiving (sharing what we have with others, acts of kindness, charity and mercy)

Traditionally, fasting had meant self denial - giving up something or going without. The idea behind this is that when we reach for the thing that we have "given up" it prompts us to think about why we have given that item up and reminds us to think about God and the Season of Lent. More recently, Lent has also become a time to take things up......giving compliments, forgiving others, being grateful...... a balance of fasting and feasting.

How can we include these three practices in our daily lives?

Prayer – We are blessed with countless prayer opportunities: when someone cuts you off in traffic, when you experience great service at the shops, when you are amazed by nature. Take these as opportunities to say a little prayer.

Fasting – More important than the chocolate you may give up, abstain from unnecessary anxiety, judging others, gossip or criticism. These too are ways of fasting.

Almsgiving – Giving does not always come from our wallets. This Lent ensure that you give due praise to others, give encouragement to those who need it and words of thanks for the many services that would normally go unnoticed.

No matter how busy you are this Lenten Season make time for HIM through your daily encounters with others.

Second Week of Lent (Week beginning Sunday 25th February)



Ronita is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines.

Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partner in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ, Ronita was able to re-enrol in her studies and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child.

After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre and is looking to a brighter future for her whole family.

"I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself," she said. "I feel hopeful for the future... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you." Watch Ronita's Story

<u>Third Week of Lent</u> (Week beginning Sunday 3rd March)





Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a

steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

"We are very thankful and grateful for the water tank. It has helped us so much and made our daily life easier," Leaia said. Watch <u>Leaia's Story</u>






Welcome to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form and also attached a copy of the travel itinerary. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for <u>5 or more school days</u>. The application form is available from the school office and must be completed <u>prior</u> to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.


