Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week our Year 6 students had the opportunity to participate in an amazing Faith Formation opportunity. Our diocese organised a brilliant program of worship with contemporary music, unpacking of scripture in a child friendly way, prayerful reflection and 'adoration'. The event ran across an entire week at Penrith Panthers and created the opportunity for every school in our diocese to bring their Year 6 students together with other school groups to worship. The Year 6 students from St Mary MacKillop attended the Friday session and it was fantastic. I was able to 'drop in' for part of the day and join with Mrs Moore, Miss Pirotta, Mrs Gillard and Miss Neilsen who also attended. I was so proud of our children as I saw how engaged they were during this event. One of our staff reflected that it was great for the kids to see that they can practice their faith and have fun at the same time. I am very hopeful that this event will become repeated year on year for future grade six students to experience. For our students it becomes an important pillar of our formation program alongside our Year 6 engagement with the Jesuit Refugee Service later in the year and the 'Lifted Junior' worship experience. For me, this is a lived expression of our school's vision to create a Christ centred community..... through a supportive partnership...

2025 Enrolments

We have now commenced our enrolment processes for 2025 kindergarten classes. As you would expect, enrolment forms are now arriving at our front office in large volumes and interviews for 2025 have begun. Mrs Brock and I are in the process of sending out our letters of offer for enrolment.

We really want to make sure that no one from within our community who is seeking enrolment for their child misses being offered a place because the classes get filled early. Therefore if you, a family member or a friend are seeking enrolment at our school, please get them to download or collect enrolment forms ASAP and get them to Mrs Brock in our office. It is likely that our first kindergarten class is filled by April 1st. We also have limited spaces available in some other grades and enrolment forms are welcome for grades other than kindergarten.

Uniform Policy

HAIR:

If hair is below shoulder length, it must be tied back with a bottle green ribbon or scrunchie. Hair is not to be coloured for either boys or girls. Hair cuts are to be suitable for school for both boys and girls.

Holy Week (Week beginning Sunday 24th March)



This year, we shared with you the story of three inspiring women from across the globe, who overcame challenges to complete their education, access water and find secure employment. Memory completed her vocational training course in carpentry and joinery. After completing a work contract at one of the largest electrical companies in Malawi, Memory now plans to return to her village and provide carpentry services to people in her community.

2024 Easter Celebration - Wednesday 27th March

To celebrate Easter, the most important liturgical season of the church year, the St Mary MacKillop community will participate in a **Stations of the Cross** prayer during Holy Week.

The Stations of the Cross are 14 stations that commemorate the events of Jesus' last day on Earth. They tell us of Jesus' love for us as he suffered and died.

The Stations of the Cross are real events that occurred over 2,000 years ago. As we pray the Stations of the Cross we journey with Jesus remembering the last day of his life.

The Stations of the Cross prayer will take place on Wednesday 27th March in the hall. There will be two sessions – one for infants and one for primary.

All parents and carers are warmly invited to attend one or both of these sessions as we prepare to celebrate the Season of Easter.

After the Easter long weekend the students will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus.





Holy Week is the last week of Lent and during this week we remember how much Jesus loves us. Whatever we do, no matter how busy or “distracted” we might be, we cannot let the power of this week be in the background of our thoughts. Jesus entered into our life so that we never experience joy and heartbreaking sadness alone.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday (24th March) and concludes with Easter Sunday (31st March). It recalls the last week in the life of Jesus Christ. The sacred events of Holy Week are:




Palm Sunday (24th March) - Commemorates the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem that was marked by the crowds who were in Jerusalem for Passover waving palm branches and proclaiming him as the king. This Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday to commemorate Jesus’ final agonizing journey to the cross.


Holy Thursday (28th March) - There are a variety of events that are clustered on this last day before Jesus was arrested. These include Jesus and the disciples last meal together, the institution of the Eucharist, the washing of the feet, the betrayal by Judas and Jesus praying in Gethsemane while the disciples fell asleep.

Good Friday (29th March) - On this day, we remember Jesus' arrest, his trial, crucifixion and suffering, death, and burial. Since services on this day are to observe Jesus' death, and since Eucharist is a celebration, there is traditionally no Communion observed on Good Friday.



Easter Sunday (31st March) - On Easter Sunday we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord, Jesus Christ who was raised from the dead, three days after his death on the cross. Through his death, burial, and resurrection, Jesus paid the penalty for sin, thus purchasing for all who believe in him, eternal life in Christ Jesus.

These seven gifts were first received in the Sacrament of Baptism and then they are strengthened in the Sacrament of Confirmation, which is one of the reasons why the Catholic Church teaches that Confirmation is properly viewed as the completion of Baptism.

The Gifts of the Holy Spirit give us strength to help us through life. The seven gifts are:

Wisdom: The ability to see God in everyone and everything everywhere.

Understanding: The ability to comprehend that we are followers of Christ.

Counsel (Right Judgment): The ability to know right from wrong and to choose to do what is right.

Piety (Reverence): The ability to have deep respect for God and the church.

Knowledge: The ability to understand the meaning of God.

Fortitude (Courage): The ability to overcome our fear and to stand up for what is right in the eyes of God.

Fear of the Lord (Wonder and Awe): The ability to be aware that God is all-powerful, all-loving, all-perfect. To be in admiration of all the wonderful things God does.

School Fees

Instalment 1 School Fees are now overdue. If you already have paid your fees, thank you. All overdue school fees should now be paid or under an arrangement.

If you are having any difficulties in paying your school fees please contact our Senior Finance Officer, Mrs Monique Kearins on 4724 3200 to discuss.

School Office hours are 8:30am – 3:30pm. All payments and enquiries can be made during this time. Payments through the office can be paid by **EFTPOS**. When paying by BPay, Bpoint & Post BillPay please use the current statement. Details are located on the bottom of the statement.

We advise that we are unable to process EFTPOS payments after 3:30pm.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. **One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.**

COLLECTING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL

If parents wish their children to be collected from school early, please send a note to the teacher. If there is a doctor's/dentist appointment or some other very important reason why your child needs to leave the school at lunch (10:45am - 11:30am) or break time (1:30- 2:00pm), we would ask you to take your child either before or after lunch or break, not during the break, as bags are kept inside the classrooms and classrooms are locked during break times.

EARTHCARE:



Catholic Earthcare Australia is a program of Caritas Australia that responds to the 'cry of the earth' and 'the cry of the poor' working to safeguard the integrity of creation.
