#### **Facilities Update**

During the school holidays, work will commence on renovating our Year 1 and Year 2 toilet block. This will be the final stage of a three year project to improve all of the student facilities in our school. Next week demolition will begin to remove some walls and fittings from the toilets and then the refurbishment will continue into the first few weeks of Term 3.

This work is only possible because of the school fees that we receive from our fantastic families. On behalf of our kids, thank you for your support.

During the holidays we will also undertake repairs on the large door in our school hall. As you know, the door has been unusable since our Cross Country this year when it broke. With our St Mary MacKillop Feast Day celebrations next term and this year's fete getting close, having the door operable again will be a great support for these events.

#### Sport Uniform Upgrade

Earlier this term we held some consultation sessions to review our current school sport uniform. It was great to have so many parents contribute their thoughts and as a result we were able to make some decisions to improve our uniform. Last week I met with a representative from Lowes to start planning changes to our polo shirt and sports shorts. We also discussed a more modern version of our zip-up jacket. During this process we reviewed the current stock levels that are being held at Lowes (we will need to purchase any unsold stock in the old style before we move to upgrade). At this point it became apparent that we have a lot of polo shirts and shorts to sell before we launch our new items. We will commence the design phase and get some samples created over the next 6 months whilst we monitor the stock levels. At this stage it may be a launch date of 2026 for our new uniform items.

<u> Jesuit Refugee Service Donation Drive – Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June</u>

Last Friday we held our mufti day donation drive for the Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) which was planned and organised by Year 6 as a part of their Term 2 Religious Education learning.

Year 6 did a great job of visiting classrooms to educate the students about refugees and asylum seekers and the difficulties they face and about JRS – who they are and what they do. They also lead whole school prayer in each classroom around the themes of 'loving our neighbour' and 'serving others.'

Year 6 promoted the mufti day, collected donations from classrooms, and then organised and packed all the items for JRS. They really put their faith into action to accompany, serve and advocate for refugees and other forcibly displaced people in our local area. They truly acted as the hands and feet of Christ.

The support of this initiative from, you, our wonderful community was incredible – so on behalf of Year 6 thank you for your amazing generosity!

Overall the donations amounted to 130 shopping bags of groceries and toiletries made up of: rice, pasta, cooking oil, long life milk, tuna, red kidney beans, lentils, chickpeas, coconut milk/cream, condensed milk, biscuits, muesli bars, pasta, oats, cereals and toiletries (nappies, toothbrushes and toothpaste, shampoo, razors and shaving cream, sanitary items, deodorant and soap.)

## Office News

#### Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

#### Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for **more than 5 school days**. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and are to be completed **prior** to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.



## **COLLECTING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL**

If parents wish their children to be collected from school early, please send a note to the teacher. If there is a doctor's/dentist appointment or some other very important reason why your child needs to leave the school at lunch (10:45 am - 11:30 am) or break time (1:30pm- 2:00 pm), we would ask you to take your child either before or after lunch or break, not during the break, as bags are kept inside the classrooms and classrooms are locked during break times.

## **COLLECTING CHILDREN AFTER SCHOOL**

Children are dismissed at 3:00pm and supervision is provided only until 3:30pm.

A classroom teacher will escort students to 'walkers' and supervise students crossing the street, riding bikes and going to cars as part of afternoon dismissal.

After school, staff will supervise children waiting for school buses or on 'waiters.' (*Waiters are to be collected after 3:10pm*) up on our playground.

If, due to extraordinary circumstances, eg: when a parent is detained, please notify the school and your child will be informed that you are delayed. Parents are reminded that all care will be given to the children but there is no formal supervision after 3:30pm when the last bus leaves the school.
