New Religious Education Curriculum: Encountering Jesus

Dear Parents and Carers,

In partnership with Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, Bishop of Parramatta, I am pleased to announce that we have a new Religious Education Curriculum called "Encountering Jesus", which will be available for use by our school communities in 2025.

This curriculum has been developed by Religious Education leaders in the Diocese of Parramatta and endorsed by leading Catholic theologians, Catholic Scripture scholars and experts in Catholic Religious Education. It has been developed in response to a range of feedback from these experts and from school communities, families and the wider community.

It offers a framework for our teachers of Religious Education to be clear on the Catholic teachings and traditions that are to be taught from Kindergarten to Year 10 in an age-appropriate manner. It is not related to any NSW Department of Education curriculum documents.

The new Religious Education Curriculum reflects our intention for all of our students to know and love Jesus Christ. For our students from Catholic families, this will serve to nurture and enrich their Catholic faith in support of their families as their first educators of faith. Our Catholic school communities also welcome students from other religious perspectives and this curriculum will help them grow in their knowledge and understanding of the Catholic tradition, which is based on faith, hope and love.

Encountering Jesus invites all students to consider how the teachings of Jesus Christ can apply to their lives.

It includes opportunities for reflection and prayer, drawing on the wisdom of Mary, the Holy Mother of Jesus, our Catholic saints and spiritual traditions. It also includes a call to faith in action, encouraging students to know and love the teachings of Christ and then live them in their families and communities, to make a difference in our world, and to help build the kingdom of God. We will continue to partner with our parishes and leading Catholic charities, such as Caritas, Catholic Mission and St Vincent de Paul, to support us in offering opportunities to bring the curriculum to life.

Encountering Jesus includes reflections connected with every piece of learning that parents and carers can access to stay engaged with the learning of their children. This is very important to us as we seek to support families in sharing the Catholic faith with their children.

We have been working closely with theologians and scripture scholars from the Catholic Institute of Sydney and the University of Notre Dame Australia to develop professional learning and formation resources of the highest quality for our teachers. This will ensure that all of our teachers who are accredited to teach Religious Education will have a strong understanding of the content being covered.

This high quality, theologically sound Catholic Religious Education Curriculum has been endorsed by a range of expert theologians, scripture scholars and Catholic religious education experts.

My prayer for CSPD is that our new Religious Education Curriculum lives up to its name and enables all of our students to encounter Jesus Christ and, through this encounter, find inspiration, meaning, purpose and peace.



Religious Education News

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Sunday September 8th



The Feast of the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary has been celebrated in the Church since about the 6th Century. This is one of only three birthdays celebrated in the Church Calendar:

- the Birth of Jesus (December 25)
- · the Birth of John the Baptist (June 24); and
- the Birthday of Mary, the mother of Jesus (September 8th)

The birth of Mary was miraculous. She was conceived without sin as a special grace because God had selected her to become the mother of His Son. There is nothing contained in Scripture about the birth of Mary, though the "Gospel of James" (a book dating from the 2nd Century AD and not part of the Bible as we know it today) fills in the gaps. According to this account, Mary's parents were Joachim and Anne. They were old and beyond the years of having children, but prayed to God that He would grant their longing for a child – which He did.

In celebrating the nativity of Mary, Christians anticipate the Incarnation and birth of her Divine Son Jesus, and give honour to the mother of Our Lord and Saviour.

The feast of Mary's birth marks a great day in the history of the world, as it was a vital step in the coming of the Jesus. Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth offers the greatest possible happiness to the world.

Office News

School Fees

The Instalment 3 School Fees are now overdue. If you are under an arrangement, please disregard this due date. If you are **not under an arrangement** all school fees should have been paid by **Wednesday**, **28th August 2024**.

School Office hours are 8:30am – 3:30pm. All payments and enquiries can be made during this time. Payments through the office can be paid by **EFTPOS**. When paying by BPay, Bpoint & Post BillPay please use the current statement. Details are located on the bottom of the statement.

We advise that we are unable to process EFTPOS payments after 3:30pm.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance. If you know your child will be leaving at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for **more than 5 school days**. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and are to be completed **prior** to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.

COLLECTING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL

If parents wish their children to be collected from school early, please send a note to the teacher. If there is a doctor's/dentist appointment or some other very important reason why your child needs to leave the school at lunch (10:45 am - 11:30 am) or break time (1:30pm- 2:00 pm), we would ask you to take your child either before or after lunch or break, not during the break, as bags are kept inside the classrooms and classrooms are locked during break times.

COLLECTING CHILDREN AFTER SCHOOL

Children are dismissed at 3:00pm and supervision is provided only until 3:30pm. Ambrose Before & After School care is available if you require care after school. Ambrose phone number is 0492 367 298.

If, due to extraordinary circumstances, eg: when a parent is detained, please notify the school and your child will be informed that you are delayed. Parents are reminded that all care will be given to the children but there is no formal supervision after 3:30pm when the last bus leaves the school.

<u>Walkers</u> A classroom teacher will escort students to 'walkers' and supervise students crossing the street, riding bikes and going to cars as part of afternoon dismissal.

<u>Waiters</u> After school, staff will supervise children waiting for school buses or on 'waiters.' (Waiters are to be collected after 3:10pm) up on our playground.



"You can't go to school you're a girl"

It is estimated that around 119 million girls aren't allowed to go to school purely because they are female. In 2008 the Taliban, a group of male leaders, banned girls from going to school. There are girls out there, our age, fighting for an education, for example Malala. Malala is a 27 year old girl born in Pakistan. Melala knew this was wrong and decided to speak up about this and why girls should go to school. Because of this when she was 15 she was shot on the left side of her head, she survived the attack and is still fighting to ensure that every girl gets a free, safe and quality education.

Almost every day I get told you're not strong, not like a boy. When really I know I have the same strength as any boy ,the strength of my mind. Like Ash Barty, her mind is astonishing. She won 3 grand slams and she was ranked 17th for tennis in the world and was selected to go to the 2020 Tokyo olympic games but in the first round she was eliminated. However that didn't stop her, in 2022 she entered for the Australian open for women's singles. Ash won all the sets she played, and won the Australian Open. She was the first Australian to win the title in 44 years. This proves that we can all be strong in the

When researching this topic, I was interested in the amount of women who were in leadership roles such as CEOs and managers in the workforce. I was flabbergasted that only 22% of women are in these sorts of roles. This led me to look into the glass ceiling effect. I get sick of it. Just like me, people like my sister think I am everyone's favourite and I am not! So you see me and vanilla ice cream are TWINS! We both have a stereotype of us, but don't quite fit that mould.

The youngest child being the favourite isn't the only stereotype we face in our lives. There are other stereotypes that affect people most, and sadly, about gender or race. SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES

WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?*

FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremly vulnerable. They need **you** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones

NO PARKING

No waiting. You have two minutes to drop-off or pickup. You must stay within three metres of your vehicle





NO STOPPING

You must not stop on a length of road with a no **stopping** sign. The first **10 metres** from an **Intersection** is a no stopping zone. **Yellow kerb** lines are also a no stopping zone.





BUS ZONE

Only a public bus can stop in a





MOBILE PHONES

Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. May be subject to Double Demerits.





SPEEDING OFFENCES

40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. May be subject to Double Demerits.



SCHOOL ZONE 8 - 938 230- 474 SCHOOL DAYS

DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.



PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.
 Do not let your children in our out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a no stopping zone.



U TURNS

U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line

PENALITIES FROM \$352 + 3 DEMERIT POINTS

DOUBLE PARKING

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.


