Dear Parents and Carers

Our school constantly strives to be:

A Christ centered community which challenges students to develop their unique gifts and talents through a supportive partnership of school, parents and parish.

Welcome back to our Year 1 - 6 families and a warm welcome to those joining our community for the first time including our Kindergarten families.

It has been such a wonderful start to 2025. A big thank you to our P & F and in particular Kirrily for organizing the big sign on the grass at the front of the school. It was a really nice way for our families to enter the school.

This year all schools in our diocese will have nine Staff Development Days instead of the usual five that occur. This is a decision made by the NSW government and is in response to recent changes to all of the syllabus documents that teachers have to follow in planning and provisioning lessons. Essentially our teachers have to re-write all of their lessons, curriculum plans etc... to make sure they follow these syllabus documents. It is a big undertaking and therefore they are being provided time to do this well. The dates etc... have all been set from outside the school and we will follow the plan that has been given to us. Ultimately it will create a better learning environment for our children.

Have you ever wondered what our school does during these Staff Development Days? Last Friday, our teachers and staff started with a CPR course to update their certification for First Aid. They then spent three hours in learning about an explicit reading strategy called 'Shared Reading' and also planning how this will be done in their class based on the student learning data collected and analysed at the end of last year.

On Monday, the teachers spent five hours planning, re-writing their lesson plans and organizing new resources to set up the teaching across the seven subject areas for this term. There is more work to be done in this area but it was a very good start to ensure we commence quality learning from the first day.

We are very fortunate to have such a dedicated and professional team of teachers at our school and they take great pride in the planning and delivery of excellent learning for each student every day.

Staffing News

We had some wonderful news just before school commenced this year. Ms Izzard and Mr Martin have welcomed a beautiful baby girl into their family. Penelope is now at home with her mum and dad as they settle into their new family routine. Mr Martin will take leave for the first couple of weeks to support his family and then will begin his teaching role with Year 3.

We pray our school will be a place of great discovery, adventure and creativity.


May it be a place where we love to learn and where we learn to love.

New Religious Education Curriculum: "Encountering Jesus"



2025 is an exciting year in Religious Education for the Parramatta Diocese as we have a new Religious Education Curriculum called "Encountering Jesus". This curriculum has been developed by Religious Education leaders in the Diocese of Parramatta and endorsed by leading Catholic theologians, Catholic Scripture scholars and experts in Catholic Religious Education. It has been developed in response to a range of feedback from these experts and from school communities, families and the wider community.

It offers a framework for our teachers of Religious Education to be clear on the Catholic teachings and traditions that are taught from Kindergarten to Year 10 in an age-appropriate manner.

The new Religious Education Curriculum reflects the intention for all of our students to know and love Jesus Christ. For our students from Catholic families, this will serve to nurture and enrich their Catholic faith in support of their families as their first educators of faith. For students from other religious perspectives this curriculum will help them grow in their knowledge and understanding of the Catholic tradition, which is based on faith, hope and love.

Encountering Jesus invites all students to consider how the teachings of Jesus Christ can apply to their lives. It includes opportunities for reflection and prayer, drawing on the wisdom of Mary, the Holy Mother of Jesus, our Catholic saints and spiritual traditions. It also includes a call to faith in action, encouraging students to know and love the teachings of Christ and then live them in their families and communities, to make a difference in our world, and to help build the kingdom of God.

We will continue to partner with our parish and leading Catholic charities, such as Caritas, Catholic Mission and St Vincent de Paul, to support us in offering opportunities to bring the curriculum to life.

COLLECTING CHILDREN AFTER SCHOOL

Children are dismissed at 3:00pm and supervision is provided only until 3:30pm. A classroom teacher will escort students to 'walkers' and supervise students crossing the street, riding bikes and going to cars as part of afternoon dismissal.

After school, staff will supervise children waiting for school buses or on 'waiters.' (Waiters are to be collected after 3:10pm) up on our playground.

If, due to extraordinary circumstances, eg: when a parent is detained, please notify the school and your child will be informed that you are delayed. Parents are reminded that all care will be given to the children but there is no formal supervision after 3:30pm when the last bus leaves the school.

COLLECTING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL

If parents wish their children to be collected from school early, please send a note to the teacher. If there is a doctor's/dentist appointment or some other very important reason why your child needs to leave the school at lunch (10:45 am - 11:30 am) or break time (1:30pm- 2:00 pm), we would ask you to take your child either before or after lunch or break, not during the break, as bags are kept inside the classrooms and classrooms are locked during break times.

Leaving Students

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

Planning a Holiday?

There are new Government guidelines for schools to follow when marking the school rolls. These guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays, during the school year, to complete a request of 'Exemption from School Attendance' form. This is required if you are taking your child on leave for <u>more than 5 school days</u>. A copy of your travel itinerary. The application form is available from the school office and are to be completed <u>prior</u> to your holiday.

Longer periods require the approval of the Director of Schools and the Catholic Education Commission.

Mobile Phones

If a child needs to bring a mobile phone to school they must be clearly labelled with the child's name, switched off and checked into the office on arrival and collected after the 3:00pm bell.

Medication

If your child takes long term medication, you must fill out the relevant form from the office. Medication will not be administered to any child unless authorised by a parent/guardian. All medication prescribed by a medical practitioner must be authorised by the doctor and all paperwork needs to be updated every year or when medication is changed. All relevant forms are available from the school office.

For short term medication, forms are also available from the school office. No child will be given medication unless it is recorded, prescribed by a doctor and in its original packaging. Many doctors will agree that medication to be given three times a day can be administered: morning, after school and before bed at night. Please check with your doctor.
